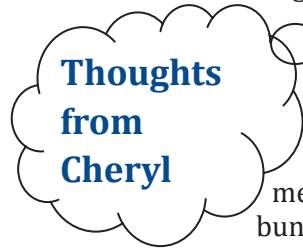

Liturgy Notes from Joann

The Sprinkling Rite and Baptism

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

At Easter we renewed our baptismal promises. During the Easter season we have been using the blessing and sprinkling of holy water (the Sprinkling Rite) in place of the Penitential Act at Mass. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) gives us the option of using the Sprinkling Rite on Sundays during the Easter Season as way to highlight the importance of baptism – our own and those who were baptized at the Easter Vigil. Whether we are dipping our finger into the baptismal font or feeling the holy water from the sprinkling rite, we make the sign of the cross as we recall our own baptism into new Life.

During the Easter Season, the Sprinkling Rite is also a continuation of the celebration of the new Life that began at the Easter Vigil for our neophytes – Garrett, Kayeng and Steven – and the songs we sing during this rite celebrate the waters of baptism – the waters which make us daughters and sons of GOD.

A “neophyte” is a beginner, a person who has just started learning or doing something. The origin of the word is from the Latin *neos*, which means “new” and *phyein*, which means “to produce, grow.” We use this word to describe the newly baptized because they are still “wet behind the ears” from the waters of their baptism and growing in their relationship with Christ.

Baptism is the sacrament that not only frees us from the stain of original sin, it also fulfills the promise that Jesus makes in today’s Gospel. We are not orphans – GOD makes us sons and daughters – members of the Body of Christ by sharing with us divine Life. It is at baptism that we first receive the indwelling of the Holy Spirit – the Advocate who helps us to live as Jesus did. As daughters and sons of GOD we are in relationship with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The more we grow in this relationship the more we will live and love as Jesus did.
