



Weekly Words from The Rock

In February 1993, Karl Keating in the periodical <u>This Rock</u> composed a quiz entitled "The World's Toughest Catholic Quiz." Trust me, it is difficult. Over the course of the next weeks we will look at certain questions from the quiz. Last week, I provided two questions for you to think about and see if you could come up with the correct answer. Here are the questions and answers.

Question 1: Holy Communion may be taken by

- a. Anyone at all, so long as he thinks it is the right thing to do.
- Any Christian who wishes to manifest the unity that Christ willed for his Church.
- c. Catholics in the state of grace, but not Protestants apart from carefully defined circumstances.
- d. Catholics who may have committed mortal sins and are sorry for them, even if they have not confessed them yet in confession and are not in a state of grace.
- e. None of the above.

Answer:

- a. Wrong, because, as an obvious case, non- Christians may not take Communion, nor may someone knowingly in the state of mortal sin
- b. Wrong. Just because one desires unity does not mean one can receive Communion. To receive Communion "for unity" one week in a Catholic Church, only to worship and receive "Communion" in one's own Non-Catholic, Christian Church the next week certainly does not bring a sense of unity. If we are about "unity" then why do we have 33,000 different Christian denominations?
- c. Correct. Since Protestants generally do not believe as Catholics do regarding the Real Presence, even if they are in a state of grace. However, those Protestants who do believe in

- the Real Presence may take Communion in **carefully defined** circumstances as defined by Canon Law.
- d. Wrong, because no one in a state of mortal sin may take Communion. Even a person who has been reconciled with God by an act of perfect contrition still must confess the sin sacramentally before receiving Communion.
- e. Wrong, because 5c is correct.

Question 2: The doctrine of the Holy Trinity means:

- a. There is one God who manifests himself in the three distinct roles of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Answer:

- a. Wrong, because this is the heresy of Modalism, which says that there is one Person in the Godhead and that person wears different "masks," so to speak, according to his different activities.
- Wrong. This is a nonsense
 answer. The very word Trinity
 comes from the prefix for three
 ("tri"), so you should have seen
 right away that the Trinity could
 not be composed of four Persons.
- c. Wrong, because this is just a rephrasing of a.
- d. Wrong, because Christians are monotheists and believe in one God, not three. No matter how closely together three gods work, they remain three gods, not one.
- e. Correct, because all the other possible answers are wrong.

- b. A layman who may distribute Communion, marry people, baptize babies and wear vestments.

In preparation for our 50th anniversary, I have been researching the early days of Resurrection for a Church History display. It has been fascinating. Even the terminology used 50 years ago has changed. What we call "members" today, were called "souls" in 1967. I like that. "How many souls are in your parish?" In 1967, there were 1,634 souls from 416 families. In 2017 we have 3,701 souls from 1,371 families. Below are basic statistics from 1967 as they compare to today.

Liturgy Notes from Joann Ascension

Today, instead of celebrating the *Seventh Sunday of Easter*, we celebrate the *Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord*. If you lived in Boston, Hartford, New York, Newark, Philadelphia, or the state of Nebraska, you would have celebrated this Holy Day last Thursday. In fact, if we went back a few years, we would *all* have celebrated the Ascension last Thursday by attending Mass. The Ascension originated as a Thursday celebration because of the story of this event from the Acts of the Apostles. In this story, Luke tells us that Jesus rose from the dead, appeared to believers for forty days and then ascended into heaven. Even though the accounts of the Ascension in the Gospels suggest it took place after a shorter period of time, the liturgy of the church honored the chronology from Acts by celebrating the Ascension on Thursday of the sixth week of Easter.

On November 16, 1998, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) voted to allow the bishops of each ecclesiastical province to determine whether the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord was to be celebrated forty days after Easter, on a Thursday, or transferred to the Seventh Sunday of Easter. The reason for this is because, even though it is a Holy Day, many Catholics were not attending Mass on Thursday. The pastoral decision to celebrate the solemnity on Sunday is so that more Catholics can celebrate the Ascension of Jesus.

The Ascension of Jesus and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (next Sunday's celebration) are inseparable. They are important events to celebrate in the Christian life. After Jesus is "taken up to heaven" (Ascension) the disciples are able to continue the ministry of Jesus – preaching the Good News of death leading to risen Life – only after they have been "clothed with power from on high" (Pentecost). This "clothing" is the Presence of the Holy Spirit who empowers them to be a new Presence of Christ in the world. The Ascension then, is both a gift and a commissioning for us. The gift is the Holy Spirit and the commission is to go forth to teach and preach in the name of Christ. We don't do this on our own. As Jesus promised, when we open ourselves to the Presence of the Holy Spirit within and among us, we are the new Presence of Christ in our world.

NOTE: Next weekend the church will be decorated with **red geraniums**. We will sell these geraniums after the 11:30 AM Mass. The color for Pentecost is red...so wear your red to Mass! Come, Holy Spirit come!

Psalm Refrain for June 4 – Pentecost (Psalm 104:30) Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.
