Weekly Words from The Rock

Question for the Week

In February 1993, Karl Keating in the periodical <u>This Rock</u> composed a quiz entitled "The World's Toughest Catholic Quiz." Trust me, it is difficult. Over the course of several weeks we have looked at certain questions from the quiz. Last week, I provided the final question to the quiz. Here is the question and answer.

Question: Apologetics means

- a. Never having to say you're sorry.
- b. The art of apologizing for being a Catholic.
- c. A course that seminarians used to have to take but that they now are exempted from by canon law.
- d. Giving reasoned explanations and defenses of the faith.
- e. None of the above.

Answer:

- a. Wrong, because while apologizing means to say "I am sorry" the word we are looking at here is "apologetics" and there is a Catholic definition of the word.
- b. Wrong, because one should never apologize for being a Catholic.
- c. Wrong, even though it is true that almost no seminaries have courses in apologetics.
- d. Correct, because this is a concise Catholic definition of the word.
- e. Wrong, because d. is correct.

Biblical Terminology

I would like to introduce something new to my bulletin column. There are many words and names that we find in the Bible however do we know what they mean? Do we know why they are important? My source for this will be Harper & Row Publishers, Copyright 1985.

This week we look at three names.

Abba – the definite form of the Aramaic word for "father" (literally "the father"), properly translated "my father" or "our father." Used by Jesus (and early Christians) to address God (see Mark 14:36; cf. Romans 8:15; Galatians 4:6). Many scholars find indications of such use of the word in ancient Judaism/Israel, but others argue that it originated with Jesus.

Abel – the second son of Adam and Eve (Genesis 4:1-16). Abel is the one who offers an acceptable sacrifice to God, although we are not told why it is acceptable. He is murdered by his jealous brother Cain. Abel in Hebrew means "breath, vapor," suggesting the fragile quality of life. In the Old Testament, it is noteworthy that Abel is not again mentioned. In the New Testament, Abel becomes a theological reference for innocent blood (Matthew 23:35; Luke 11:51; Hebrews 12:24) and an exemplar of faith (Hebrews 11:4).

Cain – the first son of Adam and Eve. Cain was a farmer whose offering God rejected in favor of the firstlings brought by his brother Abel. Angered, Cain killed Abel and subsequently denied knowledge of his whereabouts. As a punishment, God withheld the ground's fruits from Cain, who was condemned to a life of wandering. God placed a mark on Cain to warn would-be attackers that he remained under God's protection. Cain later built the first city and is regarded as the eponymous ancestor of the Kenites, who are often considered to have originated as a tribe of wandering metalworkers.

Liturgy Notes from Joann

Weddings and Customs

During the seasons of summer and the fall we have many weddings here at the Church of the Resurrection. It is my honor to meet with couples who are preparing for the Celebration of Matrimony to talk about the readings, the rites and the music.

The first consideration is whether the Celebration of Matrimony will take place within Mass or outside of Mass. Father Shawn and Father Schuster meet with the couples and decide what would be best for the couples. Normally, the Celebration of Marriage between two Catholics takes place within Mass. In fact, one option that many couples may not realize they have, is to celebrate Matrimony at a Sunday Mass! When Marriage takes place between a Catholic and a baptized non-Catholic, the rite for celebrating Marriage can take place outside of Mass during a Liturgy of the Word. In all cases, Father Shawn and Father Schuster direct the couple as to what is best.

There are specific readings, prayers and rites for the Celebration of Marriage and every couple can chose which of these they want to use. There are four customs that have become popular at weddings: the lighting of a unity candle, presenting flowers to a statue of Mary, the blessing and giving of arras and the blessing and placing of the lazo.

The Lighting of a Unity Candle

This rite, though popular with many couples, is not an official rite of the Church. This is because the symbol of unity at a wedding is already present in the exchange of rings. We do allow the lighting of a unity candle after the exchange of rings, but encourage the couples to consider the wedding reception as another option for this rite.

Presenting Flowers to Mary

This rite, though very popular, especially in some ethnic Churches, is also not an official rite of the Church. What this means is that there is no specific place within the Mass where a presentation of flowers takes place. We certainly encourage flowers as part of the décor for weddings and have even brought the statue of Mary into the Church from the Gathering Space so that where there is a great devotion to Mary, the statue can be part of the décor. We do allow for the presentation of flowers to a statue of Mary after all have received Holy Communion and before the final blessing.

The blessing and giving of arras and the placing of the lazo *are* official rites of the Church and I will tell you more about those next week.


Iuly 23rd-Summer Sunday School. Please RSVP to me so I can evaluate if there is enough interest to have Sunday School on July 23rd.

Have you ever thought about blessing your home? Perhaps you have thought of it, heard of it being done, but never thought it was something you should practice? Think about this: When you receive an invitation in the mail to a special event, does your heart leap for joy? Personal invitations are intentional and purposeful. Blessing your home can be understood the same way. Jesus's heart leaps for joy when he is invited

intentionally and purposefully into our homes, our domestic churches. Blessing homes with holy water and prayer is an outward sign of our inward faith. Intentionally invite Jesus into your home. Show him that you are purposeful in your faith. Begin by filling a bottle with holy water (we have a font that you can use by the bathrooms). Make the Sign of the Cross, sprinkle holy water in each room. While doing so, pray out loud an Our Father, Glory Be, or any prayer that comes to mind. Let God know that "for you and your household you will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24:15). Remember you can also ask a priest to come bless your home! 
