The discernment process begins with the parish. You, the parish members, are invited to call forth those individuals whom you have identified as possessing leadership skills. Nominations are placed in a specified box in the gathering space. Each individual identified is notified by a letter and invited to a meeting on August 9 at 6 pm.

The nominee begins the reflection process at home and makes a choice on whether to attend the Leadership Discernment meeting.

Those who attend are then given an opportunity to be attentive to the Spirit's promptings in their life through group dialog and individual expression. This process allows just enough reflection time for each person to consider their talents/gifts and whether the tasks and time involved can be balanced with other responsibilities.

Near the end of the time gathered nominees again have the opportunity to put forth their name for consideration in specific leadership positions of their choosing or choose to not place their name for consideration.
