Biblical Terminology

We continue our work of defining words and names from the pages of the Bible. My source for this is <u>Harper's Bible Dictionary</u>, Harper & Row Publishers, Copyright 1985.

Apostasy – rebellion or abandonment of faith. It refers in the Old Testament to Israel's unfaithfulness to God (Jeremiah 2:19; 5:6) and in the New Testament to the abandonment of Christian faith (Hebrews 6:6).

Apostle – the English translation of a Greek word meaning "one who is sent out." An apostle is a personal messenger or envoy, commissioned to transmit the message or otherwise carry out the instructions of the commissioning agent. In the New Testament gospels, the term is commonly associated with the special inner circle of Jesus' disciples, chosen and commissioned by him to accompany him during his ministry, to receive his teachings and observe his actions, and to follow his instructions. Thus, they are uniquely qualified both to authenticate his message and to carry on his work through the ministry of the church. Apostolic lists appear in Matthew 10:2-4; Mark 3:16-19; Luke 6:13-16; and Acts 1:13.

Apple – a tree-grown fruit with wide geographic distribution. Although traditionally considered the fruit from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the Garden of Eden, the apple is never mentioned by name (Genesis 2:9,17; Genesis 3:6).

Archers - warriors armed with bows and arrows. Archers played an important role in ancient New Eastern warfare since they could strike accurately from a distance while being protected by a full-length shield. Although individual archers and even target practice are mentioned in the Bible (e.g., 1 Samuel 20:35 -36), no organized Israelite archery corps is ever described. Perhaps Israel lacked the materials needed to produce composite bows and therefore never established a large archery corps. Alternately, the Bible may never have mentioned an Israelite archery corps, even though it existed. Smalls groups of Israelite archers are portraved in the Assyrian reliefs of the siege of Lachish, where several Israelite archers try unsuccessfully to stave off the Assyrian army, which incorporated a large organized corps of archers.

Liturgy Notes from Joann

Solemnities, Feasts and Memorials

Last week, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, this week we celebrate the Memorial of Pope St. Pius X (Monday), the Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Tuesday) and the Feast of St. Bartholomew, the Apostle (Thursday). So what is the difference between a Solemnity, Feast and Memorial?

A **Solemnity** is a day of greatest importance on the Liturgical Calendar. In the ranking of special days a Solemnity is more important than a **Feast**, which is more important than a **Memorial**.

Solemnities are the most important days, so important that we begin the celebration the night before with Evening Prayer or a Vigil Mass. On a Solemnity we sing/recite the Gloria and the Creed, we hear three readings at Mass, and the Presidential Prayers (Collect, Prayer over the Offering, Preface, Prayer after Communion) are unique to the day. Christmas and Easter are the greatest of Solemnities and their celebrations are extended over eight days (the Octave of Christmas and the Octave of Easter).

Feasts are the second most important days and are celebrated in the course of the day (no vigils). On a Feast Day we sing/recite the Gloria, we do not recite the Creed, we hear two readings at Mass and the Presidential Prayers are unique to the day. (Note: If the feast falls on a Sunday, the Creed IS recited and we hear three readings).

Memorials are the third most important days and are usually in honor of saints. We do not recite the Gloria or the Creed on these days and we hear two readings at Mass. The COLLECT (Opening Prayer) at the Mass is unique to the day and will always invoke the name of the saint.

Every liturgical celebration - whether it is a Solemnity, Feast, Memorial or a day in ordered time - is a doorway into the paschal mystery, an opportunity to be with Christ, the Son of God. Listen to him!


