Weekly Words from The Rock

Answer to the Multiple Choice Question for the Week

Last week, I posed a question on the rosary. This week we look at the answer.

Question: How many times is each of the following prayers recited during the course of a Rosary?

Hail Mary:

- a. 50 times
- b. 53 times
- c. 56 times

Answer: B. 53 times

Apostle's Creed:

- a. One time
- b. Two times
- c. Three times

Answer: A. One time

Glory Be:

- a. Five Times
- b. Six Times
- c. Seven Times

Answer: B. Six times

Our Father:

- a. Five Times
- b. Six Times
- c. Seven Times

Answer: B. Six times

The rosary takes the following format:

- Begin with the Sign of the Cross
- Pray the Apostles Creed
- Pray the Lord's Prayer
- Pray three Hail Mary's
- Pray the Glory Be

Once you offer up the mystery of the rosary (i.e., Annunciation) pray the following:

- One Our Father
- Ten Hail Mary's
- One Glory Be

This happens five times honoring all of the joyful, glorious, luminous, or sorrowful mysteries. The concluding prayers of the rosary can take many different formats. The simplest is to pray the Hail Holy Queen and conclude with the Sign of the Cross. Thus, following the format, do the math and you will come up with one Apostle's Creed, the Our Father six times, the Glory Be six times, and Hail Mary fifty-three times.

Biblical Terminology

We continue our work of defining words and names from the pages of the Bible. My source for this is [Harper's Bible Dictionary](#), Harper & Row Publishers, Copyright 1985.

Ark – a container of intermediate size. In the Old Testament, “ark” translates two Hebrew words, *tebah* and *aron*, both of which mean “box” or “chest.” The former is used only for Noah’s ark (Genesis 6-9) and for the ark of bulrushes in which Moses was placed (Exodus 2:3, 5). The latter designates a coffin and a chest but it usually employed a religious object, most notably, the Ark of the Covenant. Originally, the characteristic feature of the Ark of the Covenant was that it could be carried about. The Ark led the people in the desert (Numbers 10:33), was carried round the walls of Jericho (Joshua 6), and was brought into the camp during military operations (1 Samuel 4:2-4). It was kept in a tent with an attendant. According to biblical tradition, the Ark contained the two tablets of the law but the wording in 1 Kings 8:9 suggests that it may once have held something else, perhaps the two stones that formed the sacred lots, Urim and Thummim. The most striking fact about the Ark at an early period was that it was a direct manifestation of God’s presence and was virtually identified with him. Moses addressed the Ark as God, the Philistines equated the Ark with a god, and those who desecrated the Ark were struck down by its divine power. From the so-called history of the Ark, we learn of its capture by the Philistines, its devastating power in their territory, its triumphant return to Israel, and its concealment at Kiriath-jearim for some twenty years of Philistine occupation. After defeating the Philistines, David brought it from there and installed it in his new capital, Jerusalem, as part of his policy of uniting the tribes under his rule. A decisive step in the story of the Ark came when it was transferred into the Holy of Holies of Solomon’s new Temple. From this time onward, it remains stationary and is viewed as a throne, on which God sits as an invisible deity above the two golden cherubim. The belief that God resided permanently in the darkness of the Holy of Holies led to the doctrine of the inviolability of the Temple and Jerusalem. The Ark was destroyed or captured in the Babylonian sack of Jerusalem in 586 B.C. Whether there was one in the Second Temple is uncertain.

Apostle – the English translation of a Greek word meaning “one who is sent out.” An apostle is a personal messenger or envoy, commissioned to transmit the message or otherwise carry out the instructions of the commissioning agent. In the New Testament gospels, the term is commonly

associated with the special inner circle of Jesus’ disciples, chosen and commissioned by him to accompany him during his ministry, to receive his teachings and observe his actions, and to follow his instructions. Thus, they are uniquely qualified both to authenticate his message and to carry on his work through the ministry of the church. Apostolic lists appear in Matthew 10:2-4; Mark 3:16-19; Luke 6:13-16; and Acts 1:13.

Apple – a tree-grown fruit with wide geographic distribution. Although traditionally considered the fruit from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the Garden of Eden, the apple is never mentioned by name (Genesis 2:9,17; Genesis 3:6).

Archers – warriors armed with bows and arrows. Archers played an important role in ancient New Eastern warfare since they could strike accurately from a distance while being protected by a full-length shield. Although individual archers and even target practice are mentioned in the Bible (e.g., 1 Samuel 20:35-36), no organized Israelite archery corps is ever described. Perhaps Israel lacked the materials needed to produce composite bows and therefore never established a large archery corps. Alternately, the Bible may never have mentioned an Israelite archery corps, even though it existed. Small groups of Israelite archers are portrayed in the Assyrian reliefs of the siege of Lachish, where several Israelite archers try unsuccessfully to stave off the Assyrian army, which incorporated a large organized corps of archers.

Musical Musings from Joy

It is my distinct pleasure to announce the various Music Ministry choirs and ensembles Resurrection will be offering in the 2017-2018 school year. The season runs from after Labor Day through Corpus Christi. Registration forms will be available online and in the parish office over the coming week. If you have questions regarding any of the groups, please do not hesitate to contact me.

FOLK GROUP (8th Grade and Up) Minister 8pm Saturdays weekly; Rehearse 7pm Saturdays weekly. This newly-formed group serves as an option for those parishioners who cannot commit to a weeknight rehearsal, but who would like to offer their musical talents to a weekly Mass. With a "come when you can" format, members are flexible to minister weekly, biweekly, or monthly. In keeping with a folk style, this group especially suits guitarists and percussionists.

ADULT CHOIR (8th Grade and Up) Minister 8:30am Sundays weekly; Rehearse 7pm-8:30pm Thursdays weekly. The Adult Choir is Resurrection's main choral group. With a weekly rehearsal in addition to a Sunday Mass, this choir also has a responsibility to minister for bigger feasts throughout the year, including those liturgies around the Christmas and Easter seasons. Instrumentalists such as violins, flutes, trumpets, etc.

are welcomed and encouraged to join.

TEEN ENSEMBLE (8th-12th Grade) Minister 10am Sundays biweekly; Rehearsals TBD. The Teen Ensemble serves as an option for busier students who would still like to be a part of parish music ministry. This 8th-12th grade group particularly benefits those receiving formal music education in school. Student instrumentalists are invited to participate, as well.

CANTORS (8th Grade and Up) Minister various Masses; Rehearse with Folk Group, Adult Choir, or Teen Ensemble. The primary ministry of a Cantor is to proclaim the Responsorial Psalm. All Cantors must be members of the Folk Group, Adult Choir, and/or the Teen Ensemble. They act as Psalmists with their respective choir and also serve as Cantors for Masses without a choir present. An informal audition is required for those hoping to minister as Cantors. Workshops and certification are also available.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR (2nd-7th Grade) [Formerly the Youth Choir] Minister 10am Sundays monthly; Rehearsals Thursdays 6pm-7pm weekly. As the only choir for younger parishioners, the Children's Choir helps to introduce the power of sung prayer to these members. Through song, children will explore interactive and creative ways of applying their faith to everyday life in addition to ministering Sunday Mass. To sing the following month's Sunday Mass, attending a minimum of two rehearsals between Masses is required by all participants. (For Christmas Eve, Holy Thursday, and Easter Sunday, it is a minimum of three rehearsals.)
