Biblical Terminology

We continue our work of defining words and names from the pages of the Bible. My source for this is Harper's Bible Dictionary, Harper & Row Publishers, Copyright 1985.

Bar Jona – an Aramaic surname of Simon Peter meaning “Son of Jona” or “Son of John” (Matthew 16:17; cf. John 1:42, 21:15).

Bartholomew – one of the twelve apostles about whom little is known. His name appears in all of the New Testament apostolic lists but nowhere else in the New Testament. Because “Bartholomew” follows “Philip” in three of the lists (Matthew, Mark and Luke), some scholars have identified him with the “Nathanael” whom Philip brought to Jesus (John 1:45-51; Bartholomew is never mentioned in John, nor is Nathanael in Matthew, Luke or Mark). However, this identification lacks conclusive evidence. Later Christian traditions identify Bartholomew as a missionary in India.

Battering Ram – a war engine that usually consisted of a heavy wooden ramrod, probably metal-tipped, suspended within a wooden tower in a fashion that allowed it to be worked back and forth. The tower was wheeled so as to move the ram up an earthly ramp and position it at the base of the walls of a city under siege, and it was also armored to afford the protection to those within it who were manning the ram. In the Iron Age (1200 B.C. on) the Assyrians used these formidable weapons against the cities of Israel and Judah.

Beasts – large, often dangerous animals. In the Bible the word has several uses. **1.** As a general term for animals (Genesis 1:24). **2.** As a term for wild, dangerous animals (Revelation 6:8). **3.** As a pejorative term for human beings (Titus 1:12). **4.** As a term for mythical beings of allegorical symbols. In Daniel 7, four different beasts symbolize four kingdoms. In Revelation a beast from the sea symbolizes the Roman Empire, a beast from the earth represents the leaders of the province of Asia, and a beast from the abyss portrays the Antichrist.

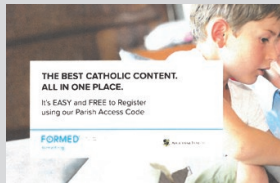

Enrichment Opportunity

Last Saturday, thirty-five liturgical ministers gathered here at Resurrection for a morning of prayer, fellowship and liturgical enrichment. The plan was to distribute a book titled “From Mass to Mission” from Liturgical Training Publications. That was my plan - but the Holy Spirit had something else in mind...

On Friday I found out that these books had *just* been shipped from Chicago. There was no way they would get here on time. I needed a plan B – so I shared my dilemma with Stacey Dorsey and she suggested using something from FORMED.org.

FORMED.org is a website that contains movies, books and videos on topics that include bible study, faith formation, sacraments, liturgy, Mary, the Saints – all things Catholic. With Stacey’s help, I found a great presentation on “The Spirit and The Eucharist”. I highly recommend this presentation and suggest that we might all approach our participation at Mass with a renewed sense of inspiration after listening to this video.



HOW TO ACCESS “The Spirit and The Eucharist” on FORMED.org

Log into our website www.rescathroch.org

Click the arrow ► at the right of the screen until you reach a screen that looks like the one on the right.

Click on the white box that says “ The Best Catholic Content in One Place”

The log-in screen for FORMED.org will open in a new window. The parish access code will appear. To register as a user enter your email and a password. If you have already registered, simply click on the blue LOGIN button and type in your email and password.

Once you get to the homepage of FORMED.org, click on the word STUDY.

When the STUDY page opens, scroll down to the heading “Discover the Catholic Faith”. Click on “The Wild Goose” to open the program.

Click on the screen arrows to scroll through the segments available.

Click on “Segment 6: The Spirit and The Eucharist” to access the video.

After listening to the video, I invite you to prayerfully reflect on these questions: Why do you attend Mass? If there is tension whether or not to attend Mass, where does that come from? As Catholics we believe that Sunday Mass is spiritually the most important time of the week. Do you approach Mass in this light? How do you prepare to attend liturgy? In what part of the liturgy do you most experience the presence of God?
