

# Weekly Words from The Rock

## Happy Mother's Day

I read a couple of stories about mothers.

Story 1 – On a Mother's Day card, a six-year old girl wrote her Mother: "Dear Mom, I'm going to make lunch for you on Mother's Day. It's going to be a surprise. P.S. I hope you like pizza and popcorn."

Story 2 – In a comic strip For Better or For Worse, Elly, a young mom, had a horrible day caring for her two toddlers who were sick.

Looking for sympathy, Elly called her own mother looking for an understanding ear. She told her mom what a horrible 24 hours she had, getting up every half hour during the night and caring for her toddlers all day – first one, then the other. She said to her mom "vou don't even get a chance to think about yourself." Then she added, "I guess you went through all this with me and my brother, didn't you?" There was a pause, then Elly said to her mom, "Mom, did we ever thank you?"

# Musical Musings from

Last week I began sharing with you some tidbits of my Irish journey, including many

of the "foreign" words I had to learn. This week, I'd love to talk to you about the schoolchildren I was blessed to help form during my two years in Wexford.

I served as a catechetical aide to **Kennedy Park National School**. Like Resurrection, there was no school attached to the parish. However, this was not out of the norm – no school in Ireland is directly attached to the Church building. Instead, they are dotted elsewhere around the towns.

Again dissimilar to here, the Catholic schools are the <u>public</u> schools. <u>Private</u> schools are non-Catholic. Meaning, a

Catholic education is <u>free to all</u> who wish to receive it. There are several reasons why people choose to go with private education in Ireland, which I'd be happy to share with anyone who's curious.

I'll be honest in saying that the Churches aren't filled on a Sunday in Ireland. Despite the fact that **over 90%** of schoolchildren attend the public, Catholic schools, many families are not Catholic or do not practice at this time. Therefore, there were several students I worked with who were getting catechesis in school, but not necessarily in Church and rarely at home. How was I supposed to make faith **"make sense"** to them?

Truly, the hardest part of what I did at Kennedy Park wasn't the catechesis. These kids have *so many* questions. *Good* **questions**. The kind that get theology students like myself even more excited about the faith. Usually they had to do with the **Trinity**, which are always hard to answer. But, even though many of the children weren't going to Church regularly, they were intrigued and curious about who Jesus is. At the end of the day, they believed. Those kids taught me so much about myself and my faith. I think about and pray for them often.

No, the hardest part of what I did at Kennedy Park was try to pronounce their names. The Irish language is very, *very*, difficult! Try some yourself: Áine, Aisling, Aoife, Caoimhe, Eimear, Eoin, Niamh, Oisín, Pádraig, Róisín, Siobhan.
