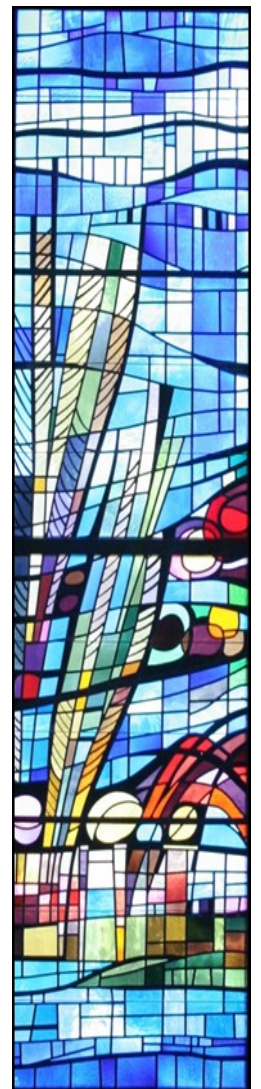


## Stained Glass Windows “The Four Seasons”

The windows in the sanctuary were designed by artist Odell Prather of Philadelphia, PA. to represent the flow of the seasons through the year.

Moving toward the altar on the left side, winter begins with its dark clouds and downward movements. Snow falls and ice builds, shadows are blue and purple. Winter fills the first three lancets and moves into the fourth. In the fifth and sixth windows, more light begins to show in the upward moving rhythms of the sky, while seeds have just begun their miraculous transition into plants. In the last three windows on this side, there is a crescendo of brightening skies, rivers and lakes and an upsurge of plant life. Spring has come.

On the other side of the altar, the three taller windows represent summer with sunlight, green forests and multicolored flowers. The flowers continue into the fourth window and then give way to fruits and grains of the harvest season. The last three windows show autumn's falling leaves and gradual darkening of the skies. Fall gradually moves toward winter and the cycle is complete. The bright warm colors of spring and summer on either side of the altar are symbols of the joy that the Resurrection brings to every heart.

**Holy Day of Obligation** Wednesday, August 15 celebrates the story of the Assumption. The Assumption reminds us that at the end of her earthly life, Mary is assumed body and soul into heaven. 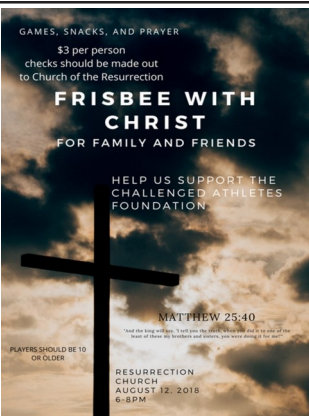

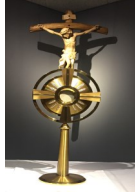

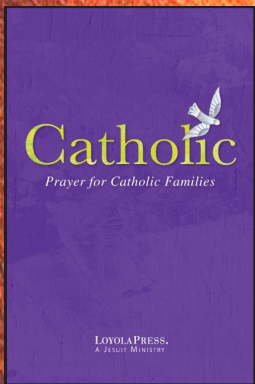
