Questions

Question: Did the apostles leave their wives and families? Since they left their jobs, how did they have any financial support?

Answer: Not all of these things are known to us. However, we ought to shed a simplistic notion that Jesus wandered about with just the Twelve Apostles. Rather, a larger group of disciples also accompanied the apostolic band.

This may have included some of the family members of the apostles. St. Luke describes the apostolic journeys as follows: "Jesus traveled from one town and village to another, preaching and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. Accompanying him were the Twelve and some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, Susanna, and many others who provided for them out of their resources" (Luke 8:1-3).

Thus we have a kind of entourage, more than a lonely band of 13 men. We do not know how many of the apostles were married at the time. But it is possible that their wives were in the group. As for support, it would seem that some of the wealthier women in the entourage assisted in underwriting the costs. Other costs may have been covered by grateful townsfolk who experienced healing and preaching.


