In the left column is the number of the commandment. In the right column is the wording of each of commandment. See if you can match each of the commandments correctly.

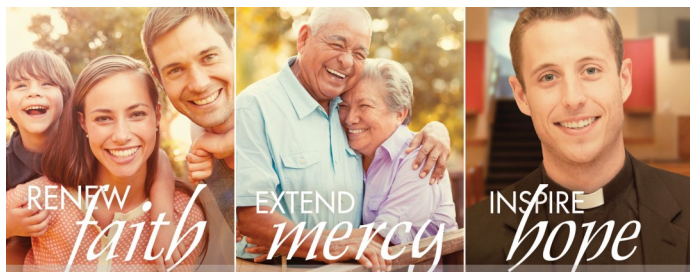

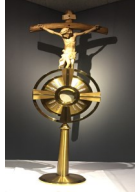
