


Praise God for the power of prayer and the desire for community. On Monday August 20th, a community holy hour was hosted at Pax Christi Church at 7pm to pray in light of the sexual abuse crisis. Over 115 people came. It was absolutely fantastic and a wonderful time of reflection and prayer. Yet, what is most inspiring is this: the holy hour wasn't organized by the priests (though they definitely helped promote it and obviously put it on). It wasn't organized by the area youth/YA ministers (though they also definitely promoted it). This wasn't organized by any particular parish office or organization (though they, again, promoted it). It happened because

Catherine Whitcomb, a young nurse in town and Pax parishioner, decided on Thursday that, in light of the news from Pennsylvania, we needed to pray, and we needed to do so as a community. And rather than waiting to see if someone else did it, she called the priests, contacted the parish, and got the thing set up. And 115 people decided they also thought that prayer was needed. You may ask, what is the point to this? What hope do we have as the Body of Christ in this crisis? If you need something from your Church, you don't have to wait for someone else to do it for you. Go out and get it. Don't be afraid to step forward. Make it happen, because odds are what you need is exactly what a lot of people also need. Class times are Sunday, 8:30 am and 10:00 am. The Children's Ministry program strives to help your child encounter Jesus through the tools of the Catholic faith. This is accomplished by blessing with Holy Water at the start of class; learning Catholic prayers, including the Sign of the Cross; teacher-led children's worship bulletin activity; learning about Saints, Virtues, and Church Holy Days, praise and worship songs with movement and completing activities and crafts in a small group setting. More

information, including the Registration forms are in the Gathering Space. Nursery Program is for children birth to 3 years old. The Nursery is opened on Sundays from 10:00 am until 11:00 am. This is not a drop in center. You must register your child(ren) in order for us to have the staff available to

care for the children.
