Weekly Words from The Rock

As I mentioned last week, over the next few weeks, I want to look into the Ten Commandments. There is much more to the commandments than meets the eye. My work comes from Father Peter Klein's Catholic Source Book, Copyright 2000, pages 82-89.

The First Commandment reads, "I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange gods before me." It is simple to understand. There is only one God and to that one God alone we owe our worship.

What sins can be committed against the First Commandment?

Sins against Faith. What are some examples of these sins?

- Heresy – obstinate post-baptismal denial of some truth
- Schism – refusal of submission to the pope or of Catholic communion
- Apostasy – total repudiation of Christian faith

Sins against Hope. Examples-

- Despair – giving up the hope for personal salvation or for help
- Presumption – i.e., presuming upon God's power or mercy hoping for forgiveness without conversion

Sins against God's Love. Examples-

- Indifference
- Ingratitude
- Luke warmness
- Spiritual sloth (laziness) – refusing the joy that comes from God
- Hatred of God, coming from pride

Sins against the Honor Due to God. Examples?

- Superstition – the deviation of religious feeling and of the practices this feeling imposes
- Idolatry – divinizing what is not God as well as false worship
- Divination – practices falsely supposed to unveil the future, like recourse to Satan, demons, the dead. Regarding divination, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches in Paragraph 2116,

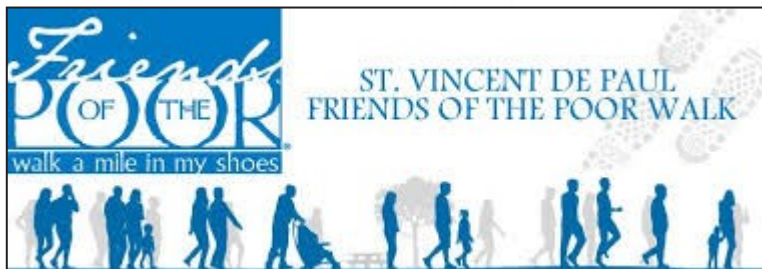
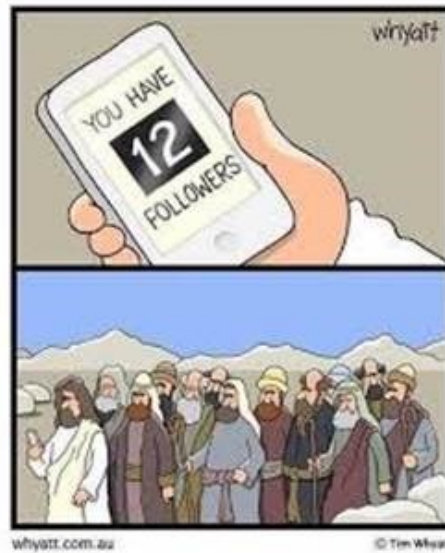
"Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to all mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history and other human beings. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe to God alone." Magic and spiritualism – attempts to tame occult powers, to place them at one's service and have power over others.

Sins of Irreligion. Examples-

- Tempting God – putting God's goodness to the test
- Sacrilege – stealing sacred things; refers to profaning sacraments, liturgical action, persons, things or places consecrated to God; normally refers to an action – desecration – but also to sacrilegious talk
- Simony – buying or selling spiritual things (See Acts 8:20)
- Atheism – considering humans as ends in themselves, and theories of economic and social liberation apart from God
- Agnosticism – a "practical atheism," ideas or indifference that often refrains from formally denying God.

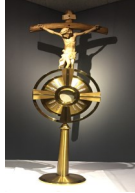

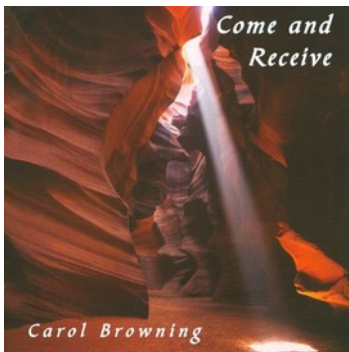
These workshops are only for members of the **Folk Group, Adult Choir, and St. Cecilia Singers**. Teen Ensemble and Children’s Choir members need not attend.

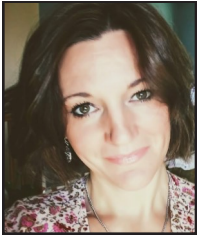

Sunday School Program. REGISTRATION IS STILL OPEN! Children must be 3 years old by August 1st and be toilet trained. Class times are Sunday, 8:30 am and 10:00 am. The Children's Ministry program strives to help your child encounter Jesus through the tools of the Catholic faith. This is accomplished by blessing with Holy Water at the start of class; learning Catholic prayers, including the Sign of the Cross; teacher-led children's worship bulletin activity; learning about Saints, Virtues, and Church Holy Days, praise and worship songs with movement and completing activities and crafts in a small group setting.
