# Weekly Words from The Rock

As I mentioned, over the next weeks, I want to look into the Ten Commandments. There is much more to the commandments than meets the eye. My work comes from Father Peter Klein's Catholic Source Book, Copyright 2000, pages 82-89. Last week, we looked at the First Commandment so now we move to the Second, Third and Fourth Commandment.

The Second Commandment reads, "You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain." As God is all-holy, we curb what we say about God. What sins can be committed against the Second Commandment?

- Promises – infidelity to promises using God’s name, engaging the divine honor and faithfulness, “in some way makes God out to be a liar.”
- Profanity – taking the name of God (Lord, Jesus, Christ) in vain (without due regard for its sacred character).
- Blasphemy – trivializing, degrading, affronting God, saints, sacred things.
- Swearing – calling God to witness (both oaths that are disrespectful though not blasphemous, like misuse of God’s name, and false oaths like perjury, which is a lie told under oath).
- Cursing – blasphemy by calling down evil (damnation).

The Third Commandment reads, “Remember to keep holy the Lord’s day.” What is asked of the Sabbath?

- Worship owed to God.
- Joy proper to the Lord’s Day.
- Works of mercy.
- Relaxation of mind and body.

The Fourth Commandment reads, “Honor your father and your mother.”

The Fourth Commandment opens the second table of the Ten Commandments (the first deals with our relationship to God) and shows us the order to charity.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#2211) notes the need to assist and ensure especially these seven freedoms:

- The freedom to establish and raise a family.
- The protection of the stability of the marriage bond.
- The freedom to profess one’s faith and raise one’s children in it.
- The right to private property, free enterprise, work, housing, emigration.
- The right to medical care, aged assistance, and family benefits
- Protection or security and health (especially against drugs, pornography).
- The freedom to form association with other families and to be represented.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#2212) teaches that our neighbor is revealed in a personal way, not as a “unit” in the human collective; but as “someone” who by his known origins deserves particular attention and respect.

- In our brothers and sisters, we see the children of our parents.

- In our cousins, we see the descendants of our ancestors.
- In our fellow citizens, we see the children of our country.
- In the baptized, we see the children of our mother the Church.
- In every human person, we see the children of God our Father.

One of the duties laid out in the Fourth Commandment is that of parents. This means:

- Creating a home where tenderness, forgiveness, respect, and fidelity are the rule.
- Educating in virtues requiring an apprenticeship in self-denial, sound judgment, and self-mastery; subordinating “material and instinctual dimensions to interior and spiritual ones”.
- Giving good example, acknowledging their own failings, correcting their children’s failings.

As part of the Fourth Commandment and “duties of citizens,” the Catechism of the Catholic Church (#2243) teaches that, after diplomacy, negotiation, and passive resistance, armed resistance by political authority is justified only under five specific Conditions:

- There is sure, serious, and prolonged violation of basic rights.
- All other efforts to redress the wrong have failed.
- Such resistance will not cause more violations.
- There is reasonable hope for success.
- There is no reasonable expectation of a better resolution.

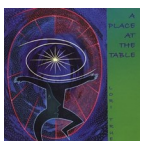
