Weekly Words from The Rock

We continue to do our study into the Ten Commandments. There is much more to the commandments than meets the eye. My work comes from Father Peter Klein's <u>Catholic Source Book</u>, Copyright 2000, pages 82-89. Last week, we looked at the Fifth and Sixth Commandment so now we move to the Seventh, Eighth, Ninth and Tenth Commandment.

The Seventh Commandment reads, "You shall not steal." What are the sins against the Seventh Commandment?

- Theft
- Deliberate keeping of goods lent, objects lost
- Business fraud
- Paying unjust wages
- Forcing up prices
- Speculation to artificially manipulate prices
- Corrupt influence of lawmakers
- Private appropriation and use of common goods
- Work poorly done
- Tax evasion
- Check and invoice forgery
- Excessive expenses and waste
- Intentional damage to private and public property

The Eighth Commandment reads, "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor." What are the sins against the Eighth Commandment?

- Lying, especially in public (this includes false witness when in court and perjury when under oath)
- Disrespecting another's reputation (slander: verbal defamation). Some examples,
- Rash judgment (assuming as true stories about another's moral fault)

- Detraction (disclosing another's faults, however true)
- Calumny (lying about another)
- Encouraging another's dishonesty (by flattery, praise or compliance)
- Boasting
- Irony (disparaging someone by malicious caricature)

The Ninth Commandment reads, "You shall not covet your neighbor's wife." What are the requirements in the battle for purity?

- The virtue and gift of chastity
- Purity of intention (seeking our true goal, God's will)
- Purity of vision external and internal ("avoiding entertainment inclined to voyeurism and illusion")
- By discipline of feelings and imagination
- By refusing all complicity in impure thoughts
- Prayer
- Modesty
- Purification of the social climate

In the First Letter of Saint John (1 John 2:16), St. John lays out two kinds of coveting against the Ninth Commandment.

- Lust of the flesh (sensual lust)
- Lust of the eyes (enticement for the eyes)

The Tenth Commandment reads, "You shall not covet your neighbor's goods." Regarding the Tenth Commandment, the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC#2536) states: "When the Law says, 'You shall not covet,' these words mean that we should banish our desires for whatever does not belong to us. Our thirst for another's goods is immense, infinite, never quenched.

Thus it is written: 'He who loves money never has money enough.'"





Feast Day of Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels Saturday, September 29th What is an archangel? The word "archangel" (Greek, *archangelos*) means "high-ranking angel"—the same way that "archbishop" means a high-ranking bishop.

Why are they called "saints" if they're angels rather than humans? The word "saint" (Greek, hagios) means "holy one." It does not mean "holy human being." As a result, it can apply to holy ones that aren't human. Since St.s Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael all chose to side with God rather than the devil, they are holy angels and thus saints. All angels that sided with God are saints, but these three's names are known to us, and so they

are picked out by name in the liturgy. What do we know about St. Michael? His name means "Who is like God?" (The implied answer is: Nobody; God is the greatest there is.)

What do we know about St. Gabriel? His name means "God is my warrior" (meaning, essentially, "God is my defender"). What do we know about St. Raphael? His name means "God heals." (National Catholic Register 1/28, 2014)




