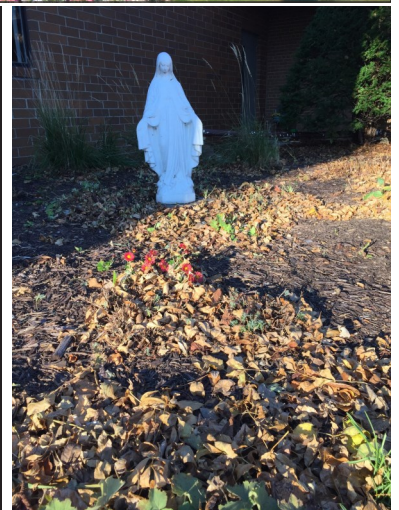

Weekly Words from The Rock

The Four Last Things

In the December 17-23, 2017 edition of *Our Sunday Visitor* (pages 9-12), we learn about the Four Last Things – death, heaven, hell and purgatory. Two weeks ago we looked at what the article said pertaining to death. Last week, we looked at purgatory and judgment. Today, we look at the sad reality of hell.

On Hell – After a person has been judged, he or she will spend eternity in one of two states: hell or heaven. (Many people think of “hell” or “heaven” as places, but they are more accurately denoted vis-à-vis the relationship with God.) Hell is defined by the Church as the “state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, Paragraph 1033). God’s judgment in such a case would be to allow the person’s choice to take effect, as the Catechism relates: “God predestines no one to go to hell; for this, a willful turning away from God (a mortal sin) is necessary, and persistence in it until the end” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, Paragraph 1037).

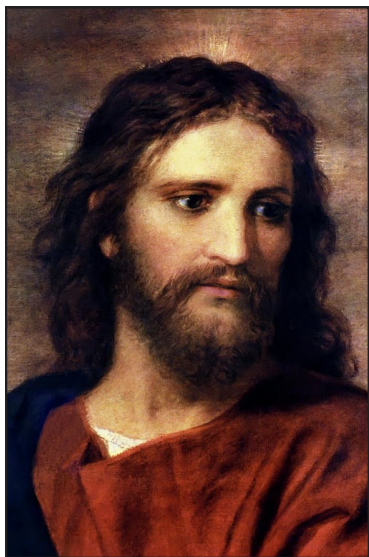
The very mention of “hell” can cause some people to cry unfair (placing them in a long tradition going back at least to when Ezekiel was writing; see chapter 18). How could a loving and merciful God allow anyone to suffer eternal damnation? Other people even ignore hell and maintain that Jesus, who loves everyone, will also save everyone. Granted, the thought of hell may be horrifying, but the words of Jesus are clear: “The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth” (Matthew 13:41-42).

To understand the terrible mystery of hell, the Church directs people to the mystery of freedom, which is a gift human beings have from God. It is a gift that bestows great dignity and enables the person “to initiate and control his own actions” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, Paragraph 1730). But freedom also means that the person is responsible for his or her choices. “The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. There is no true freedom except in the service of what is good and just. The choice to disobey and do evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to the slavery of sin” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, Paragraph 1733).

Ultimately saying no to hell means saying yes to God. Again, God does not want robots that are forced to love him, but true sons and daughters who choose to love him and their brothers and sisters in freedom. Nevertheless, if they have the freedom of love, then they also must have the freedom not to love. The latter choice leads to hell.

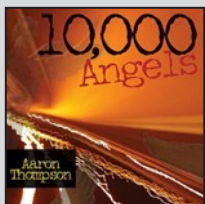

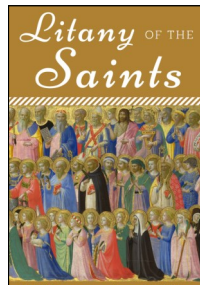

Activities for kids have included: slime-making, scavenger hunts, giant parachute and even Adoration!

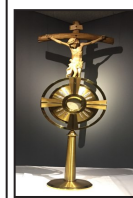
