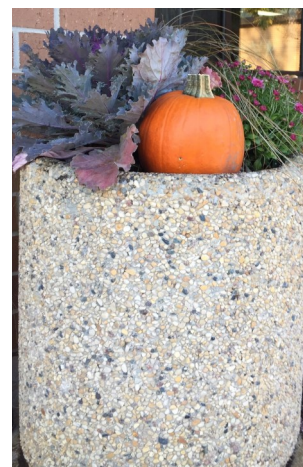

Weekly Words from The Rock

A frail old man went to live with his son, daughter-in-law, and four-year-old grandson. The old man's hands trembled, his eyesight was blurred, and his step faltered. The family ate together at table. But the elderly grandfather's shaky hands and failing sight made eating difficult. Peas rolled off his spoon onto the floor. When he grasped the glass, milk spilled on the tablecloth.

The son and daughter-in-law became irritated with the mess. "We must do something about father," said the son. "I've had enough of his spilled milk, noisy eating, and food on the floor."

So the husband and wife set a small table in the corner. There, grandfather ate alone while the rest of the family enjoyed dinner. Since grandfather had broken a dish or two, his food was served in a wooden bowl.

When the family glanced in grandfather's direction, sometimes he had a tear in his eye as he sat alone. Still, the only words the couple had were sharp admonitions when he dropped a fork or spilled food.

The four-year old watched it all in silence.

One evening before supper, the father noticed his son playing with wood scraps on the floor. He asked the child sweetly, "What are you making?" Just as sweetly, the boy responded, "Oh, I am making a little bowl for you and mama to eat your food when I grow up." The four-year-old smiled and went back to work.

The words so struck the parents that they were speechless. Then tears started to stream down their

cheeks. Though no word was spoken, both knew what must be done.

That evening the husband took grandfather's hand and gently led him back to the table. For the remainder of his days he ate every meal with the family. And for some reason, neither husband or wife seemed to care any longer when a fork was dropped, milk spilled or the tablecloth soiled.

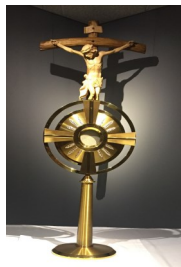

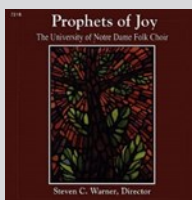

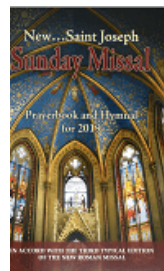

Stacey Shares: Advent Wreaths—10 reasons why your family needs an advent wreath this year:

1. Children like to help light and blow out the candles.
2. It is a way to mark the passing of time, one candle for each week of Advent. Even the youngest ones recognize this concept.
3. Lighting a new candle each week is exciting for all. We learn to be patient, one candle at a time is a good lesson for our impatience.
4. Each week is designated for a special virtue: hope, faith, joy, and peace.
5. Each year, more and more Christians are making their own version of an advent wreath and you can, too. Google "Advent wreath" and choose your style.
6. Gathering for a meal together at least once a week creates healthy families.
7. Advent wreaths make for a beautiful table centerpiece.
8. Families can pray for special

intentions each week.

9. Turn your family table into an advent scripture study for young and old. Learn the story of the Nativity of the Lord from Matthew and Luke.

10. Purple and rose candles are the colors for Advent and you can use a white candle in the center to represent Christ.
