# Weekly Words from The Rock

#### <u>Advent</u>

On the First Sunday of Advent, I offered the following thoughts on Advent. I will keep these thoughts in my column during Advent to inspire us during this season.

The A of Advent means Anticipate. Advent anticipates Christmas and for many, we can't wait for Christmas to arrive. This Advent do not wish the days away. Do one thing each day of Advent which makes you grow closer to Jesus Christ.

The D of Advent means Don't. Don't forget the state of your soul. Celebrate the gift of God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance.

The V of Advent means Volume. This is a difficult time of the year for many people. Reach out to them (volume) and let them know you are keeping them in prayer.

The E of Advent means Emulate. If we claim to be believers of Jesus Christ, let us show people that we believe by the life we live.

The N of Advent means Never. Never forget what makes this time of the year special. It isn't the food, gifts or parties. It is Jesus Christ.

The T of Advent means Time. As Jesus Christ came to us in the Christmas story which Advent anticipates, God has given us a precious gift in our time on this earth. We must never forget the way we live our time on this earth will determine our journey in eternity.





If you have not received your *Little Blue Book* for Advent yet, I highly encourage you to pick one up in the Gathering Space today! Included with your book this year, you will also find an **Advent Wreath Blessing**. If you haven't blessed your wreath yet, do not fret! It is okay to bless it later in the season. Next week, I will talk more about the significance of the wreath and its many colors, but this week, I would like to give you a taste of the blessing available with your *Little Blue Book*:



The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent

Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before. When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be led by a parent or another member of the family.

#### While Making the Sign of the Cross:

**Leader:** Our help is in the name of the Lord. **Response (R/.):** Who made heaven and earth.

Scripture Reading (Isaiah 9:1-2, 5-6; Isaiah 63:16-17, 19; OR Isaiah 64:2-7)

#### With Hands Joined:

**Leader:** Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord.



#### Stacey Shares: St. Francis and the Nativity-

The very first Nativity scene dates back to 1223. At the Christmas Mass at Midnight, St. Francis of Assisi presented a live representation of the Nativity, complete with donkeys, sheep, and a newborn baby, in a cave in Greccio, Italy. He hoped that people who



saw this moving, creative way of remembering the story of Jesus' birth would come to understand the great divine love that brought God's own Son into our world. St. Francis wanted to emphasize Jesus' poverty while on earth, and remind us that we are called to the same spiritual poverty that He had, being humble enough to accept God's will and know that we are loved by him. Since that time, Nativity sets have become a tradition in our homes during the Christmas season. Thank you, St. Francis!
