Weekly Words from The Rock

Baptism

Following our discussion of why Catholics baptize infants in this column of last week, we look at another question on baptism.

Question: Some people refer to baptism as "christening." Is the term correct?

Answer: The word "christen" is an inaccurate term for baptism. In the literal sense, to be "christened" is to be anointed with oil. But the sign in baptism is the washing with water. Even though there are anointings in the baptismal rite, they are not the essential sign (see answer to Pop Quiz, Question 2 below). So "baptism" (rooted in the Greek term for washing) is the correct term for the sacrament.

Good luck with these questions. I'll provide the answers next week along with the next series of questions.

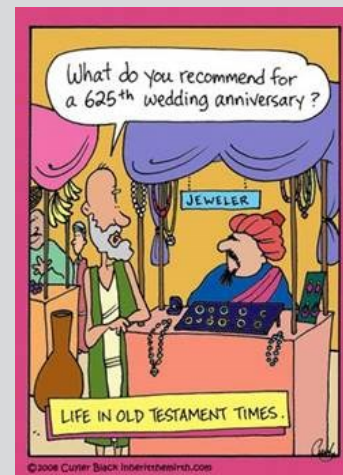

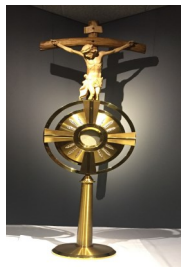

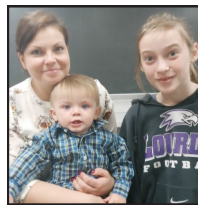
