Anointing of the Sick

World Day of the Sick is Monday, February 11. With Sunday, February 10 being the Sunday closest, Father Shawn and I would like to offer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during the 11:30 Mass.

In the sacrament, the Oil of the Infirm is administered to the forehead and palms of the hands. The words associated with the anointing are:

*Through this holy anointing,
may the Lord in his love and mercy,
help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. Amen.*

*May the Lord who frees you from sin,
save you and raise you up. Amen.*

Who should receive the anointing?

Answer: "The proper time for receiving this holy anointing has certainly arrived when the believer begins to be in danger of death because of illness or old age. Each time a Christian falls seriously ill, he may receive the Anointing of the Sick, and also when, after he has received it, the illness worsens."

What are the effects of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick?

Answer: The special grace of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has as its effects:

- ♦ the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church;
- ♦ giving the sick person the strength, peace and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age;
- ♦ imparting the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of Penance;
- ♦ providing for the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of the soul;
- ♦ helping the sick person in the preparation for passing over to eternal life.

Once again, for those who would like to receive the sacrament, we welcome people to come on Sunday, February 10 to the 11:30 Mass.

(The answer to the questions, "Who should receive the anointing?" and "What are the effects of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick?" come from the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, Copyright 2006, page 255).

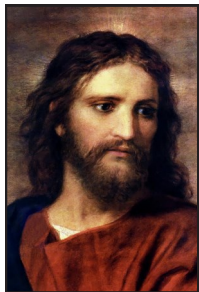

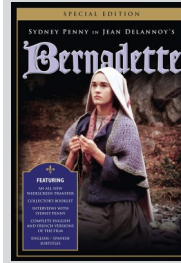

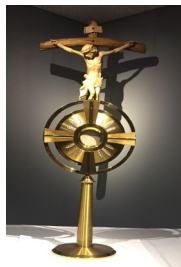

Last week, I introduced to you **St. Brigid**, the patroness of Ireland. Her feast day was celebrated this past **Friday, Feb. 1st**.

Legend has it that St. Brigid went to the **King of Leinster** to ask for **land to build her monastery**. Laughing at her efforts, he told her **she could only have as much land as her cloak could cover**. Miraculously, when she unfastened her cloak and spread it out, **it stretched out farther than anyone could see**. The King was forced to concede the land. She built the church for the monastery **underneath an oak tree**. Today, this area is known as (County) **Kildare**. (In Irish, "kil" means church and "dara" means oak.) I attended grad school in this county, and many still hold dear the story of St. Brigid's time there.

The picture you see above is actually an intricate **tapestry** that hangs in the day chapel of the church I worked for in Wexford. Brigid was also revered as a **Celtic goddess**, and is thus associated with the four elements – **earth, air, fire, and water**. You may find these represented by the border panels. This beautiful work of art was completed over a period of many years by ten parish ladies. I would estimate it is probably **18 feet tall by 27 feet wide**, at the very minimum. Every time I look at it, I find something new to ponder. My favorite detail? The **seashells** woven in the bottom panel for "water"!
