



Weekly Words from The Rock

<u>Chapter 11 Bankruptcy - Diocese of Winona-</u> Rochester

I had this section in my bulletin column of last week and would like to keep it for this week. Here are some questions and answers regarding the filing for Chapter 11 Bankruptcy of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester.

Question: Will any parishes or schools close due to

bankruptcy?

Answer: No. The parishes and parish schools within

the diocese are separate legal corporations

and are not filing for bankruptcy.

Question: Will our parish face future legal action for

past abuse?

Answer: A channeling injunction will be included in

the bankruptcy filing which protects all parishes against future claims related to past child sexual abuse by clergy. Any claim or lawsuit filed against a parish as part of the

bankruptcy will be resolved in the

agreement.

Question: How will survivors be compensated?

Answer: Survivors will be compensated through a

combination of insurance, diocesan savings, the sale of diocesan assets and other sources. The amount of compensation for

survivors is unknown at this time.

Question: What will the diocese look like after the

bankruptcy process?

Answer: There is no way to predict what the

reorganization resulting from the bankruptcy process will look like, and it would be inappropriate and non-productive to speculate. However, it is important to remember that our diocese operates within our budget and that may lessen the final impact. Because of the diocesan fiscal

management policies, we should not compare ourselves to the paths followed by other dioceses who have filed for bankruptcy.

Question: When will this bankruptcy process be

completed?

Answer: We do not know when this process will be

completed.

As the Bishop has shared at the onset of the Chapter 11 Bankruptcy process, the Diocese is collaborating with the bankruptcy court and attorneys for the survivors of sexual abuse to bring compensation, healing and justice to these survivors.

It is vital throughout the process to continue to share with you important deadlines and details. The claim filing dateline in the bankruptcy case is April 8th, 2019.

We encourage anyone who thinks they may have a claim to file a Proof of Claim with the bankruptcy court before the deadline passes. Proof of claim forms for survivors of sexual abuse are available on the Diocese's website at www.dowr.org.

We understand the difficult nature of this issue and remind everyone claims may be filed confidentially. Please share this information with family members to ensure everyone has ample notice of the process.

The day to day operations of our Diocese, including administration, Catholic schools, parishes, Catholic cemeteries, Catholic Charities and the seminary will continue as usual during the bankruptcy process.

We want to reassure everyone that for more than 15 years, important measures to protect our children have been in place in our Diocese. We continue to take steps to keep children safe, including running background checks on all clergy, employees and volunteers: training facilitators of the VIRTUS® "Protecting God's Children for Adults Program and hosting VIRTUS® program sessions that have trained over 12,000 adults across our Diocese.


