Weekly Words from The Rock

Safe Haven Sunday

Parishes throughout the Diocese of Winona-Rochester have been asked this weekend to speak on the topic of pornography. To say that pornography is pervasive is an understatement.

Here are some statistics from the packet of information I received.

Studies indicate that:

- 93% of boys and 62% of girls were exposed to pornography before the age of 18.
- 71% of teens have done something to hide what they do online from their parents. This includes cleaning browser history, minimizing a browser when in view, deleting inappropriate videos, lying about behavior, using a phone instead of a computer to browse, blocking parents with social media privacy settings, using private browsing, disabling parental controls, or having email or social media accounts unknown to parents.
- 57% of young people seek out porn once a month.
- 75% said their parents had never discussed Internet pornography with them.
- One in 10 American males view porn daily.
- 68% of men and 18% of women said they used pornography at least once every week. Another 17% of men and another 30% of women said they used pornography 1-2 times per month.
- 56% of divorce involves one party having "an obsessive interest in pornographic websites."

What I find personally frightful is how innocently one can be exposed to pornography. Type in a word with one letter misspelled and pornography is present. It is rampant and open discussions need to take place between parents and children and spouses. Pornography is destroying the very fabric of family, marriages and social interaction within our society.

Along with opening the lines of communication, what can we do spiritually? The packet provides five suggestions.

1. I want every person in this parish to learn how to pray the rosary to invoke Mary in this battle. She brought us her Son who crushed the Serpent's head. Her intercession is powerful. Pray the rosary in your home with your family, individually or as family when you are on the road.

- 2. Reverent worship is a weapon in the battle and so, in addition to faithful attention at Mass, I ask each of you to sign up for a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration, or to share an hour with your family or friend. Come receive a blessing in the Lord's real presence, and train your eyes to look up to the Holy One in our midst.
- 3. Men, I encourage you to invoke Saint Joseph in this battle and to ask his intercession. See in him a great companion and example of what it means to be a man of faith, strength and purity in the family.
- 4. Don't forget the value of reading and praying with Sacred Scripture, taking on practices of fasting and using devotionals like Holy Water and religious medals.
- 5. Make a regular confession and take the necessary steps to find an accountability partner.
- 6. Finally, take up the Novena of Mary, Undoer of Knots.

Our battle spiritually is with the evil one. It is the devil who is using pornography to cause division within households and our places of worship. One of the great tools the devil uses is secrecy. Spouses, when you were married, what was the one thing you desired of each other? Keep the lines of communication open because secrets kill. Thus, talk, communicate, and take up the conversation of pornography with your children.

Finally, let us keep each other in prayer.

Ministers to Sung Worship: The Choir Here is our next segment on "The Choir":

"The primary ministerial role of the choir is to sing various parts of the Mass in dialogue or in alternation with the rest of the assembly. Some parts of the Mass, like the **Kyrie** and the **Agnus Dei**, have the **back-and-forth form of** a litany, so they work well as this kind of dialogue. Other parts have a **call-and-response form**, in which the choir intones a line that is repeated by the congregation. The Gospel acclamation works a bit like this. **Other parts of the Mass may** be sung in various ways—sometimes by the choir alone, sometimes by the whole assembly, sometimes in alternation between the choir (or a cantor) and everyone else. Two long texts may be sung this way: The Gloria may be sung by everyone together, or by the congregation alternately with the choir, or even by the choir alone; and the **profession of faith** may be sung by all together or alternately between the congregation and the choir. The three major processional chants of the liturgy—the entrance, offertory, and Communion chants—may be sung alternately between the choir and the congregation or even by the choir alone, and the first two (entrance and offertory) may be sung by all together. **The place for the choir in the building reflects** its ritual function: The official texts say that the choir should be located where it is clearly part of the whole assembly but also where it can best do its assigned tasks."1

Were you aware of the choir's role as it is laid out by the Church? What parts do you find yourself singing or not singing at Mass? Why?


