# Weekly Words from The Rock

## Scripture in the Mass

We continue with our study of the Mass. Our recent work has focused on where the words from our Mass stem from various verses in Sacred Scripture. Last week began our study centered on the Introductory Rite, Penitential Rite and Gloria. We begin this week with the Profession of Faith. So pull out your Bibles and let us get underway!

## Profession of Faith:

**I believe in one God**, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. *See Genesis 14:19*

**Of all that** is seen and unseen. *See Colossians 1:16*

**I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ**, the only Son of the God, eternally begotten of the Father. *See Luke 1:35*

**God from God**, light from light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, one in being with the Father. *See Hebrews 1:3*

**Through him** all things were made. *See John 1:1-4*

**For us men** and for our salvation he came down from heaven. *See John 3:13*

**By the power** of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man. *See Matthew 1:18*

**For our sake** he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. *See John 19:16*

**He suffered**, died and was buried. On the third day he rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures. *See 1 Corinthians 15:3*

They are met with challenges of poverty, hunger, illness and natural disasters with hearts full of love and compassion as well as tangible solutions so that people in need have food, shelter and medical care. ## Musical Musings from Joy

This week, we will look at the first two principles from our NPM article, "How Firm a Foundation":

"1. The Liturgy Is the Action of Christ. Liturgy does not belong to any one individual or to a local community or even just to the present members of the Church. The liturgy belongs to Christ as an exercise of his priestly office (SC, 7), that is, as an expression of Jesus Christ's total self-offering to the Father in love and fidelity. This priestly act is carried out today by Christ present in the Church. Christ acts through the Church in three ways: in the baptized members of the Church who gather for worship (and in a particular way through ordained ministers), in the proclamation of the Word (and in a particular way in the Gospel), and in the sacramental elements (uniquely in the bread and wine of the Eucharist).

2. The Liturgy Leads Us to Authentic Gospel Living. As our hearts and minds are transformed through the grace of God, we are called to respond to that grace and move beyond the walls of our churches into a world greatly in need of love, care, and concern. We are called to be living signs of the reign of God for the salvation of the whole world. The late Pope John Paul II made such authentic living of the Gospel a measure of the effectiveness of our liturgy. In his apostolic letter *Mane Nobiscum, Domine* (2004), he wrote: 'By our mutual love and, in particular, by our concern for those in need we will be recognized as true followers of Christ... This will be the criterion by which the authenticity of our Eucharistic celebrations is judged' (Mane, 27)." 1

What thoughts strike you in reading this? Does the "action of Christ" in liturgy lead us to "authentic Gospel living"?

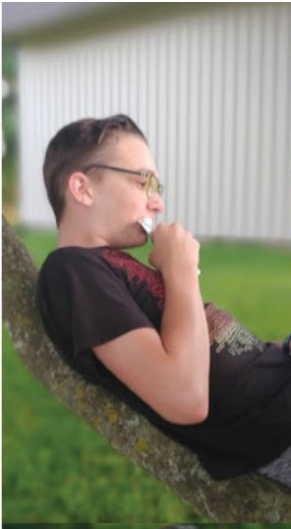
