Mercy

The Second Sunday of Easter, which marks the eighth and final day of the Easter octave, is known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The gospel is the story of Thomas and how his doubt turns to belief. To Thomas, Jesus extends a hand of mercy.

However, do we really know what mercy is? Mercy is giving to another what they do not deserve. Think about the story of Peter. Three times he denies knowing the Lord. Does he deserve mercy? Is he entitled to mercy? Has he done something to merit mercy? No! Yet, it is to Peter that the Lord extends mercy.

The story of Peter and Thomas is wrapped up in our stories. Because of sin, we don't merit mercy; God doesn't owe us mercy. Still, God offers us mercy because we are his creation/his children. Ah, "doubting" Thomas. If we were honest with ourselves, we all probably have a bit of him in us. In a culture that relies so much on the "visual," (TV, internet, social media, etc.,) how can we NOT doubt something unless we SEE it with our own eyes?

Have you ever had an experience of faith that you've only felt? Maybe it was at a particularly moving Mass or at a Marian shrine somewhere in the world. 
