Weekly Words from The Rock

Question

Question: When does a person receive his guardian angel, at birth or when one is baptized?

Answer: The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches of the guardian angels: "From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care" (No. 336). Hence an angel is assigned from the moment of conception.

That the unbaptized also have an angel assigned seems likely, as well, and is deduced from the fact that the Old Testament (e.g. Psalm 34:7; Job 33:23-24 and Tobit 12:12) speaks of the unbaptized Jews as having or being in the care of the angels.

Clearly our angels can have greater care of us if we are baptized since they can tap into the grace of the sacraments. Angels also can have greater care for us if we are docile and not rebellious. While angels are powerful, they are not all-powerful such that they can overrule freedom or save us from every foolish danger we expose ourselves to.

Totus Tuus at Resurrection For children entering 1st-6th grades this summer, Totus Tuus will be the week of July 8-12, 9:00am-2:30pm Monday-Friday.
