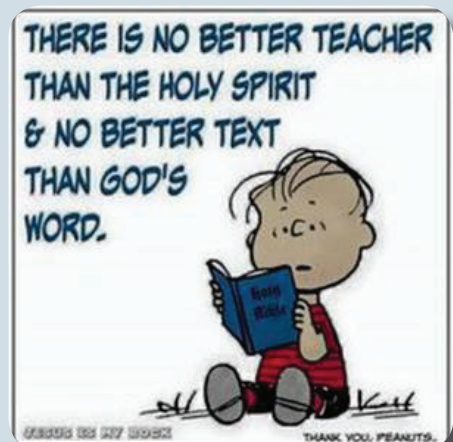

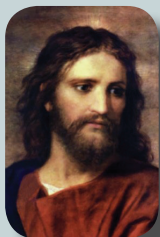

Many people thought she was crazy, and that it was inappropriate for a young girl to dress in armor like a man. But her faith soon changed their hearts. She demanded that everyone in the army lead lives of purity so that God could work through them and though she was very afraid, she led them into battle with a flag that said, "Jesus, Maria."
