Unfortunately, Joan was captured and accused of heresy and the king did not defend her. She was put on trial for heresy (telling lies about the faith) because she would not deny that the voices that spoke to her were sent by God. It was an unfair trial with many trick questions, but she answered them all with simplicity and truth. Still, she was condemned and was burned at the stake. Later, her trial was re-investigated and she was declared innocent. In 1920, she was canonized a saint. St. Joan of Arc, pray for us! Amen.
