Weekly Words from The Rock

Scripture in the Mass. We continue with our study of the Mass. We begin this week with the Eucharistic Prayer (specifically Eucharistic Prayer 1). So pull out your Bibles and let us get underway!

<u>Preface:</u> Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. *See Isaiah 6:3.* Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. *See Mark 11:9-10*

Eucharistic Prayer 1: We come to you Father, with praise and thanksgiving through Jesus Christ your Son. See Ephesians 5:20. Through him we ask you to accept and bless these gifts we offer you in sacrifice. See 2 Maccabees 1:26. We offer them for your holy catholic Church, watch over it Lord and guide it: Grant it peace and unity throughout the world. See John 17:21. We offer them for N. our Pope, and N. our bishop, and for all who hold and teach the Catholic faith that comes to us from the apostles. See Acts 2:42. Remember, Lord, your people, especially those for whom we now pray. Remember all of us gathered here before you. You know how firmly we believe in you and dedicate ourselves to you. Psalm 106:4 We offer you this sacrifice of praise for ourselves and those who are dear to us. See Hebrews 13:15 We pray to you, our living and true God, for our well-being and redemption. In union with the whole Church: (Christmas) we celebrate that night when Mary, without loss of her virginity, gave the world its savior. See Matthew 1:25. We honor Mary, the ever-virgin mother of Jesus Christ our Lord and God. We honor Joseph, her husband. See Matthew 1:16. We honor the apostles and martyrs Peter and Paul, Andrew, ... and all the saints. May their merits and prayers gain for us your constant help and protection. See Revelation 8:3-4.

Father, accept this offering from your whole family. Grant us your peace in this life, save us from eternal damnation, and count us among those you have chosen. See Colossians 1:11. Bless and approve this offering; make it acceptable to you, an offering in spirit and in truth. See John 4:24.

Let it become for us the body and blood of Jesus Christ your only Son our Lord. The day before he suffered he took bread in his sacred hands and looking up to heaven to you, his almighty Father, he gave you thanks and praise. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: this is my body which will be given up for you. When supper was ended he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to his disciples and said: take this, all of you, and drink from it: this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for many so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me. *Matthew 6:26-28; Colossians 11:23-26*

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith. See 1 Timothy 3:16. Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. See 1 Corinthians 15:3-5. Father, we celebrate the memory of Christ your Son. We, your people and your ministers, recall his passion, his resurrection from the dead, and his ascension into glory; from the many gifts you have given us we offer to you, God of glory and majesty. See 1 Peter 18:21. This holy and perfect sacrifice. See Hebrews 9:13-14. The bread of life and the cup of eternal salvation. See John 6:54. Look with favor upon these offerings and accept them as you once accepted the gifts of your servant Abel. See Genesis 4:4. The sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith. See Genesis 22:12. And the bread and wine offered by your priest Melchizedek. See Genesis 14:18 Almighty God, we pray that your angel may take this sacrifice to your altar in heaven. See Revelation 8:3-4 Then, as we receive from this altar the sacred body and blood of your Son, let us be filled with every grace and blessing. See Ephesians 1:31. Remember, Lord, those who have died and gone before us marked with the sign of faith, especially those for whom we now pray N. May these and all who sleep in Christ, find in your presence light, happiness and peace. See 1 Thessalonians 4:13-14. For ourselves, too, we ask some share in the fellowship of your apostles and martyrs, with John the Baptist, Stephen, ..., and all the saints. See Colossians 1:12. Though we are sinners, we trust in your mercy and love. Do not consider what we truly deserve, but grant us your forgiveness. See Psalm 25:7. Through Christ our Lord you give us all these gifts. You fill them with life and goodness, you bless them and make them holy. See Psalm 104:27-28

We will continue our study next week beginning with the Lord's Prayer.

Musical Musings from Joy

This week, we will look at the third principle from our NPM article, "How Firm a Foundation":

"3. Full Participation in the Divine Plan Stems from and Leads to Full Participation in the Liturgy. The Church was established to spread the Gospel through word and action (Matthew 28:19–20).

The liturgy is the 'primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit' (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 14) which will lead to participation in the Church's mission. Therefore 'full, conscious, and active participation' in the liturgy (SC, 14) is essential in order to shape people to serve as ambassadors of Christ, bring salvation to the world, and live as redeemed people.

'Full' participation is both internal and external, for we are embodied spirits.

If we are to be conformed to Christ, we need to 'embody' the attitudes of worship, prayer, devotion, petition, celebration, sorrow, and rejoicing.

We need to hear the Word and to proclaim it in spoken and sung prayer, acclamation, psalmody, and hymnody.

We need to savor the Eucharistic elements and the cleansing power of water, the smooth anointing of oil, and the touch of hands invoking the Spirit, if the Spirit and the Word and the sacramental presence of Christ are to transform our spirits."1
