Weekly Words from The Rock

Scripture in the Mass

We continue with our study of the Mass. Our recent work has focused on where the words from our Mass stem from various verses in Sacred Scripture. Over three weeks, our study has centered on the Introductory Rite, Penitential Rite, Gloria, Profession of Faith, Preparation of the Altar and Gifts, Preface and Eucharistic Prayer. We conclude our study this week with the Doxology, Lord's Prayer, Lamb of God and Preparation for Holy Communion, and Dismissal. So pull out your Bibles and let us get underway!

Doxology:

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, almighty Father, forever and ever. Amen. See Romans 11:36

Lord's Prayer:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. See Matthew 6:9-13

Deliver us, Lord, from every evil and grant us peace in our day. In your mercy, keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. *See John 17:15*

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and forever. See Didache – "The Teaching of the Apostles" – First century writer.

Musical Musings from Joy

This week, we will look at the fourth principle from our NPM article, "How Firm a Foundation":

"4. The Church Is One Body with Many Ministries. The primary liturgical role, of course, is that of the whole Body—the liturgical assembly of believers brought together by the Holy Spirit. But, like a human body, the Body of Christ needs specialized 'members' who perform various ministries so that the whole Body may function properly.

These special ministers include ordained members (bishops, priests, deacons) and baptized members who are appointed to a ministry. The goal of each ministry is the action of the whole Body in sharing in Christ's worship of the Father, and each ministry has both responsibilities and limits. Each individual should perform the whole of what is required by the role, but only that which is required (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 28), acting 'with the sincere devotion and decorum demanded by so exalted a ministry and rightly expected...by God's people' (SC, 29)."1

What thoughts strike you in reading this? Are you involved in a liturgical ministry? Why or why not?

Do you see this is a right or a responsibility of your baptism?

If you are not involved in a "specialized" way, what holds you back? Is it the time required? The talent needed? What if you were told that none of this mattered?

If you are involved in a liturgical ministry, why did you first say "yes"? What call did you answer to? Are you happy serving the Body of Christ in this way? Would you ever consider doing something more or even different?
