

Grades 1-5: Faith Formation classes for public school and home school children begin on Monday, September 16th. During the first class, we will have parents and children meet in Fr. Zenk Hall. Catechists will be introduced and the children will go to their classes while the parents attend the parent meeting. We have catechists for all the classes at 4:30pm and 6:00pm classes. Parents can volunteer to assist the catechists by signing up on the first day

of classes during the parent meeting. If you have not registered your children for classes, forms and calendars are located in the Gathering Space. Please complete the form and turn it in as soon as possible. Children who attend one of the Rochester Catholic Schools are also welcome to register and attend class.

First Reconciliation: If you have a child in second grade or older and would like to have them prepared to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion, plan on attending the Parent Meeting on Monday, September 9th at 6:00pm in Fr. Zenk Hall. All families should have received a mailing describing the sacrament requirements and a purple sacrament prep form. Please bring the purple form, sacramental fee of \$50 and your child's baptismal certificate, only if baptized at a parish other than Resurrection. If you did not receive the mailing, please contact Stacey.

Virtues in Practice: One of the best ways for children and families to stay connected to the saints is to learn about how they lived virtuous lives. Every month we will concentrate on one virtue and two saints that exemplified that virtue. These saints will be highlighted in the weekly bulletin. This year, all the virtues will fall under the theme of charity. September's virtue is charity, which is loving God with all your heart, mind and strength and your neighbor as yourself. Charity is one of the theological virtues that God gives us in baptism. It comes from Him, allows Him to dwell within us, and leads us to Him in heaven. Charity is another word for love.
