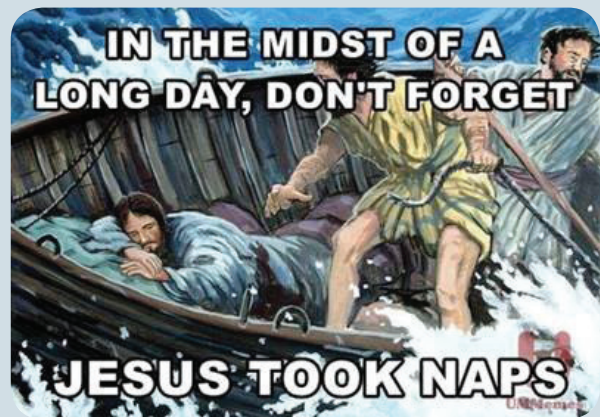
A Reflection

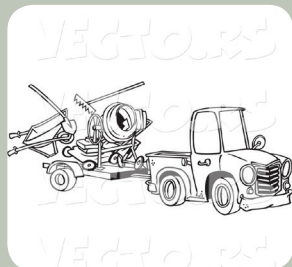
Parish Events
