**How Can I help?** *I am glad that you asked.*

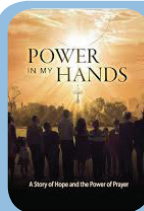
It takes lots of special people and volunteers to make this event a success. We've got a great team of leaders so far, but need help in the following areas:

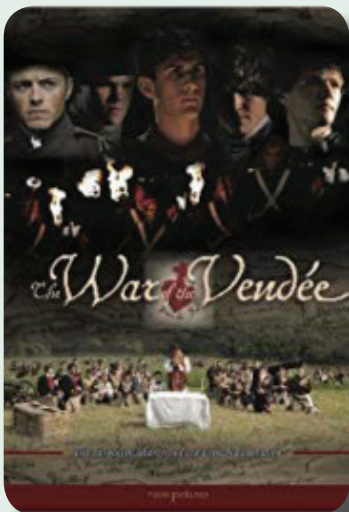
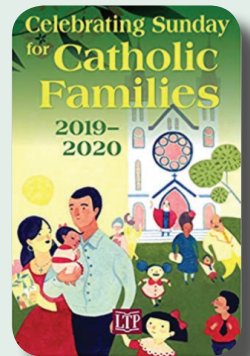
