Works of Justice- A Fund to aid the Work of Social Justice. Most parishioners are aware of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) that conducts a collection in our parishes in November (weekend of Nov 23rd/24th). CCHD is the national, anti-poverty program of the U.S. Catholic Bishops. The Bishops have given CCHD the mission to address the root causes of poverty in the United States by promoting and supporting community-controlled, self-help organizations. You may not be aware that 25% of the funds collected in the CCHD campaign remains in our Diocese. These proceeds help support "Works of Justice" fund, which awards up to \$5,000 for organizations that meet the criteria of operating local anti poverty programs. Works of Justice Funds are available for all organizations that fit the criteria of addressing root causes of poverty.
