Virtues in Practice: January's virtue is fortitude and our two saints for the month are St. Bernadette and

St. Joan of Arc. Let's define the virtue of fortitude as being brave and strong in the face of trials. Fortitude is being strong enough to stand up for what is right, even when it is difficult. Many people today talk about passive, assertive, and aggressive behavior. Assertive behavior is a type of fortitude. If we see someone doing something dangerous, deceiving others, or hurting someone, the virtue of fortitude helps us to get involved to solve the problem. Aggressive behavior that tries to overpower another person is not virtuous, because it fails to respect their dignity. Passive is the opposite of active. In tense situations, fear often tempts us to be passive and not to act, and we should pray for the grace we need to be brave and act when needed.
