Lenten Penitential Observance of Fasting and Abstaining

-Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstaining.

-All Fridays in Lent are days of abstaining.
-Abstaining is defined as not eating meat. It is followed by those who are 14 years of age and older.
-Fasting is defined as only one full meal each day, nothing between meals. It pertains to those who are 18-59 years of age.

The Sins and Struggles of our Parish: An Interactive Parish Opportunity

In the bulletin prior to Lent we asked people to reflect on a sin that was keeping them from Jesus or a struggle holding them down. At the Ash Wednesday Masses, people had an interactive opportunity to share their sins and struggles. Black paper (representing one's soul) and black pens (so only God can see) were used for people to write their sin or personal struggle.

These black papers were then collected and later placed at the base of the Altar representing the Sins and Struggles of our Parish. As a parish during Lent, we will pray for the sins and struggles placed before the Lord. Lastly, the sins and struggles will be used to start the bonfire at the beginning of the Easter Vigil Mass.

If you were not able to participate on Ash Wednesday, you are still welcome to do so. Simply take a few minutes by walking to the front of the church. There you will find a stand with directions on how you can share your sin or struggle with God.

Here is the final passage of our current article, "Many Churches, One Church":

"We've also learned that there is more work to do, if there is to be authentic inculturation of the Catholic Church and its worship, but that we must move carefully, so that we do not become victims of one or another passing cultural fad. And we've learned that trying to shape appropriate worship for ethnically diverse congregations, such as those in the United States, is a new challenge unanticipated by the Second Vatican Council and unexperienced in many places in Africa. Still, our two-thousand-year history as Church contains so many examples of the successful articulation of the Good News and successful shaping of worship in new nations and cultures that we can be confident that the Holy Spirit will help us to do so once more."1

What past experiences of liturgy can you recall where there was a cultural "twist" or tie-in that you have not seen since? Or something that has fallen out of practice from an earlier time? Do you think there's a point where liturgy can become too inculturated?

I ask you to ponder and reflect on these ideas more deeply as we enter into the mysteries of Lent. May Jesus continue to walk with us as we journey to the Cross and strive to understand our Brothers and Sisters in Christ throughout the world.
