Weekly Words from The Rock

Who Are We?

In the Liturgy of the Hours, there is a reflection entitled "The Christian in the world." It is a letter to Diognetus and reads:

"Christians are indistinguishable from other men either by nationality, language or customs. They do not inhabit separate cities of their own, or speak a strange dialect, or follow some outlandish way of life. Their teaching is not based upon reveries inspired by the curiosity of men. Unlike some other people, they champion no purely human doctrine. With regard to dress, food and manner of life in general, they follow the customs of whatever city they happen to be living in, whether it is Greek or foreign.

And yet there is something extraordinary about their lives. They live in their own countries as though they were only passing through. They play their full role as citizens, but labor under all the disabilities of aliens. Any country can be their homeland, but for them their homeland, wherever it may be, is a foreign country. Like others, they marry and have children, but they do not expose them. They share their meals, but not their wives. They are in the flesh, but they are not governed by the flesh. They pass their days on earth, but they are citizens of heaven. Obedient to the laws, they yet live on a level that transcends the law.

Christians love all men, but all men persecute them. Condemned because they are not understood, they are put to death, but raised to life again. They live in poverty, but enrich many; they are totally destitute, but possess an abundance of everything. They suffer dishonor, but that is their glory. They are defamed, but vindicated. A blessing is their answer to abuse, deference their response to insult. For the good they do they receive the punishment of malefactors, but even then they rejoice, as though receiving the gift of life. They are attacked by the Jews as aliens, they are persecuted by the Greeks, yet no one can explain the

reason for this hatred.

To speak in general terms, we may say that the Christian is to the world what the soul is to the body. As the soul is present in every part of the body, while remaining distinct from it, so Christians are found in all the cities of the world, but cannot be identified with the world. As the visible body contains the invisible soul, so Christians are seen living in the world, but their religious life remains unseen. The body hates the soul and wars against it, not because of any injury the soul has done it, but because of the restriction the soul places on its pleasures. Similarly, the world hates the Christians, not because they have done wrong, but because they are opposed to its enjoyments.

Christians love those who hate them just as the soul loves the body and all its members despite the body's hatred. It is by the soul, enclosed within the body, that the body is held together, and similarly, it is by the Christians, detained in the world as in a prison, that the world is held together. The soul, though immortal, has a mortal dwelling place; and Christians also live for a time amidst perishable things, while waiting the freedom from change and decay that will be theirs in heaven. As the soul benefits from the deprivation of food and drink, so Christians flourish under persecution. Such is the Christian's lofty and divinely appointed function, from which he is not permitted to excuse himself."

Written in the late fourth, early fifth century, how true these words remain to this day!

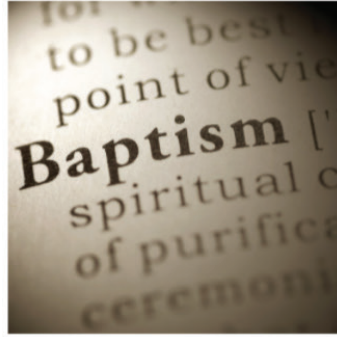

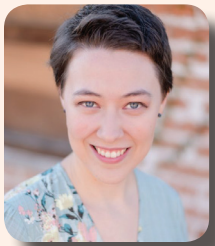

Ever heard of Carlo Acutis? If you haven't, the feast of Corpus Christi is the perfect time to learn about him! Carlo Acutis was born in 1991 in Italy. From a very early age, he was a wiz with a computer. He was fascinated by the Eucharistic miracles and spent years researching all the ones recorded in history. He took all the information he gathered and created a website with his computer skills to allow everyone the chance to learn more about them.

Throughout his life, he battled with leukemia. Even then, he inspired others to have faith in Christ and to believe in the Gospel. He died in 2006 at the age of 15.

There are four steps a person goes through to be canonized, or called a saint:

1. A formal request is made that a person be considered a saint. A bishop gathers information and listens to witnesses. If the bishop agrees, the person is given the title "Servant of God."
2. The Congregation for the Causes of Saints review the bishop's information. If they decide that person was indeed virtuous in his/her faith, that person is given the title "Venerable."
3. If that person was a martyr or if a miracle is attributed to him/her, that person is given the title "Blessed."
4. If one more miracle is attributed to that person, he/she is canonized as a "Saint."

Carlo was granted the title "Blessed" in October 2020. Other miracles witnesses attribute to him are currently being reviewed. If he becomes a saint soon, he will become the first millennial saint. Carlo is a great reminder to all of us that saints aren't super-human beings, but people like us that made a choice to dedicate their lives to Christ.
