# Weekly Words from The Rock

I want to devote my column this week to two stories I have kept over time.

Story 1 – The Difference between Optimists and Pessimists

An optimist sees the best in the world, while a pessimist sees only the worst. An optimist finds the positive in the negative, and a pessimist can only find the negative in the positive. Here is one such example:

An avid duck hunter was in the market for a new bird dog. His search ended when he found a dog that could actually walk on water to retrieve a duck. 
