This week, I discovered that I was using incorrect word usage when providing aid to a specific demographic. "This is a great thing to find out," the go-getter voice inside me said. "Now you can do a better job of helping others with this new knowledge!" But, of course, the bad little voices started interjecting. "I'm doing the best I can!" whined one. "It's not my fault—I didn't know any better!" another protested. And then the worst voice emerged: "If people are upset that I tried but got it wrong, then that's on them. It's not like I'm the cause of the problem."

How many times have we come across this voice and listened to it? We might truly care, for instance, about protecting our vulnerable, yet we moan and groan when we're asked to complete any sort of safe-environment training. Maybe we have the means to give food to the hungry, but it's so low on our priority list that we forget or decide to help later. And what are we doing to help put an end to racism, climate change, or the degradation and destruction of life in all its stages? We might not be the cause to any of these problems, but are we the solution?

Our world is hurting. This is something we can't ignore. What's more, we cannot expect things to get better on their own. But we can choose to become Christ's hands and feet here on earth and actively spread his love to the world, like making a note to buy extra food for the hungry or discovering new ways to be more inclusive to all people through our words and actions and teach them to others. Let Christ's active ministry bring forth the healing our world needs.

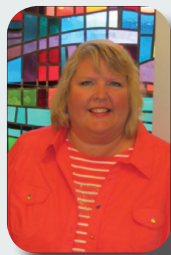
ILF 4:12
