"Have you ever thought about how your personality changes over time? Perhaps not drastically so. However, because we are constantly learning new things, we are also constantly getting a new perspective on life. We are gaining new insights on ourselves and the world around us.

For instance, 7 years ago I was realizing my dream to be the next Olympic gymnast might be crushed because of all of my injuries and lack of selfconfidence. Not only did I sprain my ankle, I also suffered from a back injury and a stress fracture in my wrist. Because I began gymnastics at a late age, I always felt like I had to try harder because all the other girls were levels ahead of me.

Fortunately, that was also the year I joined the Catholic Church. That year, God taught me that I was one of his beloved children. God made me exactly who I was meant to be. I learned that the trials I was facing and those I had faced in the past were just stepping stones on my journey to him. It may sound very dramatic now, but for a 12-year-old trying to learn where she fits in the world, it was a revelation to learn that someone other than my mother thought that I was a gift to the world.

When I look back at who I was then, I see a young girl just barely discovering her potential. Now I find joy volunteering at the church. It is hard for me to even imagine a world without God in it.
