Grades 1-5: We have Faith Formation class on Monday, September 27th at 6:00-7:00pm.

Ways to Celebrate the Angels: This week we celebrate the Archangels (St. Michael, St. Gabriel, and St. Raphael) on September 29th and our Holy Guardian Angels on October 2nd. Here's some ways to honor the angels:

•Teach your kids about angels from the Bible and the Catechism of the Catholic Church (#325-354). We know angels are purely spiritual creatures, created by God. They are messengers of

God. When people die, they do not become angels. Instead, we may be one of the known or unknown saints.

- Teach your kids about Satan (a fallen angel) who has rejected God.
- •Read about the fall of the angels in the catechism (CCC #391-395).
- •Read about angels in the Bible- there are more than 300 references (Acts 12:5-10 an angel rescues Peter from prison; Isaiah 6:1-7 vision of the seraphim; Daniel 6:10-23 Daniel and the lions; Genesis 21:14-19 Hagar and Ishmael are rescued in the desert; Luke 1:26-38 Gabriel is sent to Mary; and Luke 2:9-15 angels appear to the shepherds).
- Pray to the angels with the Prayer to St. Michael and the Angel of God prayer.
- Make an angel craft (angel puppets out of socks or paper bags, or handprint angels using paper and finger paints) or bake sugar cookies in the shape of an angel.
- •Plan an angel party complete with angel hair pasta and angel food cake.
- •Be like an angel—be messengers of God's love by making small angel cards with messages of hope, faith, and love inside. Leave the cards to surprise others or mail them to family or friends.
