Weekly Words from The Rock

Your Questions Answered...Angels

Our Sunday Visitor provided an "In Focus" on angels in its September 29-October 5, 2019 edition (pages 9-12). There is a certain fascination about angels so let us see what we can learn.

The question we posed last week was, "Where do angels appear in Scripture?" Two answers provided were:

1. Angels appear throughout the Bible in both dreams and bodily form. The Book of Revelation recounts a vision of seven angels with trumpets standing before God (cf. Revelation 8:1-2). In the Old Testament, Jacob dreams of a ladder with angels ascending and descending (Genesis 28:10-12).

2. Angels are sent to exhibit God's strength. An angel remained guarding the tree after Adam and Eve were cast out of the garden (Genesis 3:20-24). King David and the Israelites were to be punished by God by an angel, but with repentance and sacrifice of the king, the angel relented in the plan to destroy Jerusalem (2 Samuel 24).

Here are other answers which can be provided:

1. Angels are often sent for protection. In the Book of Exodus, Moses received an angel sent by God to guard him and lead him into the Promised Land (3:2, 23:20-22).

An angel saves three young men – Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego – from being tortured by King Nebuchadnezzar in the third chapter of Daniel.

And in perhaps the most famous account of Biblical angelic protection, after he was thrown into the lion's den, Daniel is saved by an angel who shuts the lions' mouths (Daniel 6:19-22).

2. Angels offer assistance. An angel brought Elijah food, providing him sustenance for his meeting with the Lord on Mount Horeb (1 Kings 19), and Joshua was restored as high priest by an angel in the third chapter of Zechariah.

3. Angels are found in the New Testament. The first chapter of the Gospel of Luke depicts the angel Gabriel appearing to Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, to tell him that God would finally bless him and his wife Elizabeth with a child. And later he speaks to Mary at the Annunciation, when he announces that she was to become the mother of the Lord. In the Gospel of Matthew, Joseph sees an angel of the Lord in his dreams three times: to make Mary his wife, to flee to Egypt and return to Nazareth.

The Gospels chronicle appearances of angels throughout the life of Christ, starting with heralding his birth to shepherds: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests" (Luke 2:14). Later, angels minister to him after he is tempted in the desert (Matthew 4:11) and strengthen him during his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:43). Even after Jesus' passion, angels appear to two of Christ's closet disciples: Mary Magdalene sees two angels in white appear at the tomb (John 20:12-13), and an angel rescues Peter from imprisonment by King Herod as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles.

Next week, we will look at the different types of angels.

The Wisdom of Fulton Sheen

I have been reading a book entitled The Wisdom of Fulton Sheen. The book shares a thread of Bishop Sheen's wisdom for each day of the year. In the weeks ahead, I would like to share some of his wisdom.

February 8 – "Counsel involving right and wrong should never be sought from a man who does not say his prayers."

February 19 – "God has given different gifts for different people. There is no basis for feeling inferior to another who has a different gift. Once it is realized that we shall be judged by the gift we have received, rather than the gift we have not, one is completely delivered from a false sense of inferiority."

March 10 – "In almost nine cases out of ten, those who have once had the faith but now reject it, or claim that it does not make sense, are driven not by reasoning but by the way they are living."

If there's one thing singers know how to do, it's freaking out over the littlest things. I should know.

Any time I get a sore throat or the sniffles, I go into panic mode. I down the water, ginger, and lemon, run the vaporizer day and night, talk only when necessary, and have a massive panic attack. And while this seems ridiculous, singers know that the voice is surprisingly fragile, and one swollen blood vessel can suddenly mark the end to a person's voice.

So when I cut my finger on a rotary wheel yesterday, you might imagine what followed. After all, playing the piano is just as much my life. And this was no shallow wound. I therefore walked into the church the following day up to my ears in pain and panic, that is until I read through Day 2 of the Consecration of St. Joseph describing him as the Light of the Patriarchs. I can't even begin to imagine what must have been going on in Joseph's mind when he found out the child Mary would give birth to was the Messiah. Whatever his fears, he shone the paternal light of God as he welcomed Mary into his home and served as father for the child Jesus.

We've got two options. We can spend time in fear, fretting about what we can't control, or we can choose to be the light of Christ by reminding others like me that no matter what happens, Christ is forever present in our lives. Let's pray today that we can sacrifice our fears to God so we might be beacons of hope.

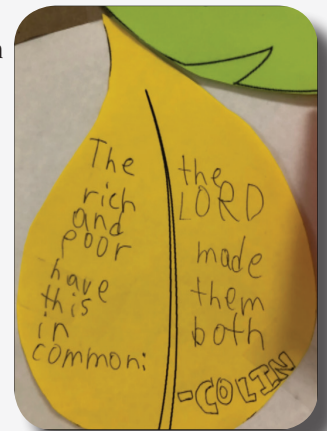


News from Stacey, Grades 1-5, Family Ministry, dre1to5fm@rescathroch.org.
