Franklin/Montessori at Franklin Elementary

Dear Church of the Resurrection,

Thank you so much for your ongoing generous donations of food, clothing, winter gear, school supplies, hygiene items and special requests! The Community Room at Franklin is used every single day. Here are some updates from a typical week in the Community Room in November:

- 4th grade Sudanese boy stops in for lotion because his skin gets very dry;
- Several students come in to borrow tennis shoes for PE;
- A para with a special needs student comes in for a soft snack,
- A student with lots of family issues arrives late and stops in for a snack,
- 3-4 students ask for personal hygiene items toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo;
- A Resurrection volunteer delivers groceries from our Community Room pantry to 2 families;
- We give out the bananas from Resurrection each week with the food bags,
- A new student arrives and is given a new backpack with school supplies,
- A teacher asks for winter gear for a student,
- Students stop in daily to borrow or keep gloves, hats, boots, coats, etc.

We also had conferences at Franklin in November and gave out winter clothing (coats, snow pants, boots, hats, gloves) to over 40 kids on the two conference nights. The families appreciated it so much. Thank you all for contributing to the well-being of our Franklin Elementary students!




