I have been reading a book entitled The Wisdom of Fulton Sheen. The book shares a thread of Bishop Sheen's wisdom for each day of the year. In the weeks ahead, I would like to share some of his wisdom.

October 1 – "The Church knows too that to marry the present age and its spirit is to become a widow in the next."

October 9 – "One would not generally put garbage into the stomach, but too often one will put garbage into the mind."

October 17 - "Make this experiment if you believe in God or not. At your first opportunity, stop in a Catholic Church for a visit. You need not believe, as we Catholics do, that Our Lord is really and truly present in the tabernacle. But just sit there for an hour, and within that hour you will experience a surpassing peace the like of which you never before enjoyed in your life. You will ask yourself as a sensationalist once asked me when we made an all-night vigil of adoration in the Basilica of Sacre Coeur in Paris: "What is in that Church?" Without voice or argument or thundering demands, you will have an awareness of something before which your spirit trembles – a sense of the Divine."

If you received Cash Calendar tickets in the mail that you do not want to purchase, please return them to the Church Office ASAP. The deadline for all entry stubs, money and unsold tickets to be returned is Feb. 1, 2022. This deadline allows time for all tickets to be accounted for, a requirement of the MN State Gambling Board.

Stop in the Office to purchase tickets at \$30 per ticket. Your ticket makes you eligible for 52 chances to win cash prizes ranging from \$50 to \$500. There are only 1200 tickets available so you have great odds to win cash AND support Resurrection Catholic Church. Remember that all buyers and prize winners must be 18 or older.
