I have been reading a book entitled The Wisdom of Fulton Sheen. The book shares a thread of Bishop Sheen's wisdom for each day of the year.

In the weeks ahead, I would like to share more of his wisdom.

December 1 – "Deep sorrow does not come because one has violated a law, but only if one knows he has broken off the relationship with Divine Love."

December 2 – "It is characteristic of any decaying civilization that the great masses of the people are unconscious of the tragedy. Humanity in a crisis is generally insensitive to the gravity of the times in which it lives. Men do not want to believe their own times are wicked, partly because it involves too much self-accusation and principally because they have no standards outside of themselves by which to measure their lives."

December 3 - "But in a conflict between truth and darkness, truth cannot lose."

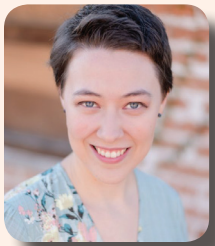

I am a classic middle child, ambitious and rebellious. In the past few years, though, I find my dreams changing. I am bothered when I hear even the "gentlest" of swear words. It's scary seeing myself evolve into a person I can't recognize.

When preparing for our Study of the Eucharist in Lent, I came across this quote from Joseph Ratzinger, a quote that I think all of us need to hear:

"Ultimately the Church draws her life from the Eucharist, from this real, self-giving presence of the Lord. Without this ever-new encounter with him, she would necessarily wither..."

"You cannot walk constantly with the Lord, cannot ever anew pronounce these tremendous words, *This is my Body and my Blood*, you cannot touch the Body of the Lord again and again, without being changed and being led by him. We may of course lag behind, but in the long run there are only really two possibilities: either to shake off the Eucharist, with the enormous demands and power it sets up in life, or to surrender to it, to hold fast to it. Anyone who holds fast to the Lord will not be abandoned by him."

As I surrender to Jesus Christ, as I witness and receive his sacrifice through his real presence in the Eucharist, I continue to be transformed by God. And it can be quite frightening, for at times I worry I'll no longer know who I am. But that's just it—I know who I am, who I've always been. I am God's unworthy child who finds salvation through his loving grace. I am a sister to all of you as a part of the Body of Christ.

I encourage you, brothers and sisters, to continue surrendering yourself to Christ, for "Anyone who grapples with him calmly and patiently, humbly and sincerely, will be led by him; he will never be denied his light."

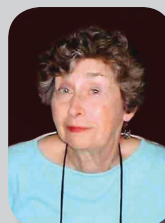

Faith Formation



News from Stacey, Grades 1-5, Family Ministry, dre1to5fm@rescathroch.org.

Grades 1-5: We have Faith Formation on Monday, February 28th for grades 1-5. The 3rd graders will have the opportunity to receive the sacrament of reconciliation during class time. The 5th graders are tying fleece blankets to give to those in need. The 4th graders will tie blankets, too.

Totus Tuus 2022: The Team will be at Resurrection Monday, June 27-Friday, July 1st for grades 1-6. Registration is now open on our website under Faith Formation, grades 1-5, Totus Tuus.

Teaching Kids to Care by Practicing Virtues: We will spend the spring and summer months talking about virtues with the assistance of a book for catechists by Sr. Janet Schaeffler, OP. Our virtue this week is consideration.

How do we teach children to have regard or respect for others and to avoid doing something that will make another person sad, upset, or angry? First, talk about how we know when someone is upset, sad, or angry. Next, decide if we are the cause of these emotions. Then, set a goal to be more considerate of each other. Families can have a goal that each family member will do at least two considerate things each day and then share your actions at dinner or bedtime. Or share ways to be considerate to others as a daily plan at breakfast time. St. Paul reminds us, "Let love be sincere...love one another with mutual affection; anticipate one another in showing honor."

Romans 12: 9-10 **Prayer for consideration:** *O God, circle us with your love. Remind us to be a circle of consideration that continually reaches out to others. We give thanks that your love-above us, beneath us, behind us, before us, within and around us-strengthens us to be considerate of all in your family. Amen*

Last weekend Resurrection hosted a Mercy Mission with Steve Angrisano. We were blessed to have a special youth event Monday morning. Roughly 35 middle through high school students gathered to explore their faith through story telling, song, and prayer. Steve encouraged the students, to have fun, keep their prayer life simple, and to keep Jesus at the center of their lives. We can achieve this by beginning each day with a simple prayer: "Jesus help me be who you need me to be today, Amen." Then, end the day with "Jesus here is how I sinned, I am sorry. Amen."

A big take-away from one youth that rally resonated was that "being holy doesn't mean being holier-than-thought, it's remembering to invite Jesus into all we do."

How true!
