

If there was a saint whose words make me want to jump up and scream "Hallelujah!," it's St. John Chrysostom. Take part of this homily, for instance, about the Eucharist:

"Since Jesus Christ, the Divine Word, says: 'This is My body', let us believe His words and give our assent to them; let us behold His body with the eyes of our mind, for Christ does not show Himself to us in a sensible way, but under sensible things He gives us all that is intelligible (in other words, that we can perceive with our mind only).

"He has acted in like manner in baptism, for there He bestows a gift through a sensible thing, that is, water; by means of the water there is effected something intelligible, the spiritual regeneration and renovation. For, if you were incorporeal (that is, had no body), He would have given you purely incorporeal gifts; but, since in you your soul dwells in your body, He gives you intelligible things in a sensible (or material) envelope.

"Many people nowadays say, 'I wish I could see his shape, his appearance, his clothes, his sandals.' Only look! You see him! You touch him! You eat him! And you desire indeed to see His garments; and He grants you not only to see Him, but also to eat Him, to touch Him, to receive Him within you. Therefore, let no one approach with disgust or with indifference, but let all do so inflamed with love, fervor and eagerness."

So let us come together and see Christ, touch Christ, and receive Christ so that our hearts be set on fire to love and serve our Savior and Lord. Song of the Week: "Remembrance" by Matt Maher Text of the Week: St. John Chrysostom's 82nd Homily (Google it!)

Teaching Kids to Care by Practicing Virtues: Wonder is the virtue we are going to focus on this week. Wonder is astonishment at something awe-inspiring, astounding or marvelous. Spoiler alert!! Kids are much better at practicing wonder because everything is new to them. "As a gift of the Holy Spirit, wonder and awe helps us remember that God is creator and we are creatures. We appreciate the extraordinary and the unique; we notice the little and great amazements of life. Wonder is the foundation of prayer and spills over into how we live." How do we increase our wonder? Do not keep your wonder to yourself, point out a beautiful sunset or the fragrance of flowers or the power of the rainstorm. Spending time in nature as a family, bonds you together with shared discoveries. We can ask each other questions from our readings at Mass: how do you think the disciples felt when everything turned white and bright? What do you think Moses and Elijah said to Jesus? What material do you think Peter wanted to make the tents out of? What do you think God's voice sounded like? Exploring new ways to ask, show, and tell stories to each other is another way to practice the virtue of wonder.

Prayer for Wonder: God of wonder, you have gifted us with wonder, we are in awe of everything around us. As wonder brings us closer to you, help us to cherish all your gifts. Amen.
