- D. Simon of Cyrene

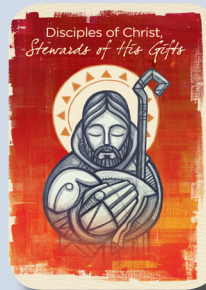

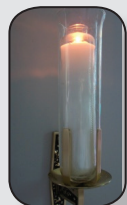

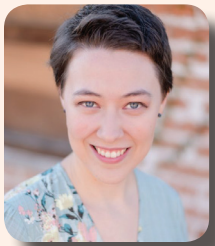

One day, my aunt invited me to ride in a hot air balloon with her. As this is something I've wanted to do since the day I was born, I readily agreed. We were about to get into the basket when I remembered I had to send an email first. So I went home and wrote the email. I was about to join the fun when I realized I should probably change clothes. Then, when I opened my garage, I remembered I didn't have my car with me. You might have guessed that I missed the flight of a lifetime, but what you might not have guessed is that my alarm clock woke me up soon after.

I find that this dream is the perfect example to state the point I'd like to make in this article: ***Do not let anything keep you from the love of Christ.*** In particular, do not let anything keep you from the true presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. I cannot stress enough that the Eucharist is a sacrament, a manifestation of God's grace. Through this very sacrament and his sacrifice, Christ once again offers salvation to you, to me, and to the world. This is a far greater deal than an air balloon ride—every time we come to Mass, we visually see God's love and receive it!

Yet even before COVID, we've seen so many people stop coming to Sunday Mass for a myriad of reasons. Now, I don't have all the answers to solve this problem, but I do know two things:

First, the change needs to start with each and every one of us. If you are not as regular in attending Mass, think of this as a new invitation to come and join your brothers and sisters as the Body of Christ to hear God's word, receive his grace, renew Jesus' covenant with us, and spread the love we receive to the world. If you regularly come to weekend Mass, think of this as an invitation to seek God's love further. Join us once a week for Daily Mass. Adore the Blessed Sacrament. Read the Bible. Pray before meals. Do not be complacent in your faith; rather, grow in Christ's love each and every day.

Secondly, it is up to us to spread God's invitation of love to the world. Call a family member or friend and invite them to join you at Mass. Make plans with another parishioner to sit with them next week and eat together in fellowship afterwards. Especially, pray. Pray for those you do not see, that they may hear God's call once again.

My fellow brothers and sisters, I repeat: ***Do not let anything keep you from the love of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.***

First Communion: Parent/child learning centers are on Monday, April 4th, open 4:00-7:00pm. Centers take about an hour to complete. Remember to bring your completed workbook.

Totus Tuus 2022: We are happy to announce that the Team will be at Resurrection Monday, June 27-Friday, July 1st, 9:00am-2:30pm every day for the grades 1-6 Day Camp. Registration is online at rescathroch.org. Go to Faith Formation, Grades 1-5 and Totus Tuus. Tuition is \$25/child or \$50/ family; scholarships are available. Adult and teen volunteers will be needed for lodging of the men and women, classroom helpers, snack/lunch set up and clean up. More details as we get closer to summer.

Teaching Kids to Care by Practicing Virtues: Lent is the season to ask God for his forgiveness. Let's look at what forgiveness means. Forgiveness is "letting go of the desire to get even with someone; to stop feeling anger toward someone/about something." Asking for forgiveness and receiving forgiveness are difficult for young children. Help them understand the steps of forgiveness: acknowledging what happened, experiencing feelings, asking God's help, forgiving, and letting it go. Children need to learn that we need to forgive others, even if the other person isn't sorry for their actions or words. Here are some questions for discussions on forgiveness: When have you been forgiven? How do you know you've been forgiven? Why do you think the person forgave you? Do you think the person you hurt felt better or worse after they forgave you? How did you feel after you were forgiven? What is your relationship like with the person now? Did this experience make you more or less likely to repeat the hurtful behavior?

Pray for forgiveness: Forgiving God, your love and forgiveness are always there for us. Help me to let go of hurts; help me to forgive others. Help me to let go of anger and grudges; help me to reach out in loving care to others.
