It begins on Good Friday (Apr 15th) and ends on the eve (Apr 23rd) of the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday. Each day of the novena - bring to Jesus a different group of souls and immerse them in His ocean of Mercy that they may draw whatever grace the souls need, especially at their hour of death. Teaching Kids to Care by Practicing Virtues: During the spring and summer months, we'll be practicing virtues with the assistance of a catechist book by Sr. Janet Schaeffler, OP. On this Palm Sunday, we look at God's greatest gift to us, His Passion. We can practice our generosity in many ways. It is the willingness to freely and unselfishly share who we are and what we have with others, often providing more than is needed or normal. Being generous is not giving money only, and it is not about

getting recognition or rewards. Teach children about anonymous giving. Look in the book of Proverbs for scripture about the challenges of living generously. Then research local charities and pick a few to support in ways that are both monetary and non-monetary. Remember the people that live closest to you, your neighbors, by helping with yard work or dropping off a plate of cookies with a happy note. Teaching children to value gifts other than money will help them to value generosity in others. **Prayer for generosity**: Lord, teach me to be generous. Teach me to give and not to count the cost.
