Weekly Words from The Rock

Happy Easter

I would like to wish all of you a Happy Easter! The difference years make. When I was a child, I recall going to Mass with my family. Before Mass, the Easter Bunny had a habit of hiding candy throughout the house. We would look far and wide and what wasn't found would have to wait until after Mass. At my age and being a priest, there is no more attending the same Mass with my family at Saint Casimir's in Wells, Minnesota. There is no more searching for candy prior to or after Mass. However, one thing hasn't changed; the message of Easter. Jesus Christ is Risen!! I can't help but think how that message has impacted my family and myself. For me, priesthood doesn't make sense without the resurrection. In fact, there is no priesthood without the resurrection. Thus, no matter who you are or where you are, may the message of Easter define who we are.

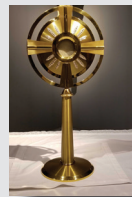

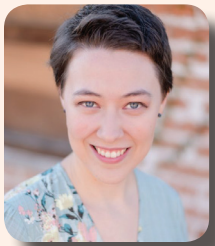
The chaplet of Divine Mercy is a very simple prayer which calls down God's mercy and many graces. It is prayed on the rosary beads. It is tied to the Holy Mass. On the Hail Mary beads we meditate on the scripture as in the Liturgy of the Word at Holy Mass.

The prayers on the Our Father beads we offer to God the Father the body, blood, soul and divinity as in the liturgy of the Eucharist.

Whoever will recite the chaplet only once will receive great mercy at the hour of death.

Teaching Kids to Care by Practicing Virtues: During the spring and summer months, we'll be practicing virtues with the assistance of a catechist book by Sr. Janet Schaeffler, OP. This week, we are practicing gentleness. "Nothing is so strong as gentleness, nothing so gentle as real strength." St. Francis de Sales. Jesus teaches us gentleness; he showed God's love with quiet strength. He was gentle with people's hearts. Turn to scripture to see how God wants us to be gentle with each other: Proverbs 15:1; Proverbs 16:24; Ephesians 4:2; Philippians 4:5; and Colossians 3:12-14. Practice gentleness by giving each child an uncooked egg in a Ziploc baggie, explain that the egg is similar to people's feeling. They must gently carry the egg with them all day without putting it down. At the end of the day, check on the eggs. Even the youngest children understand that our words and actions can hurt others.

Prayer for gentleness: Gentle God, guide me to be gentle in the things I say and do. Show me new ways to be gentle to all I meet, in all I do. Amen.
