Weekly Words from The Rock

Life's Lessons

To teach the lessons of life, one must never be afraid to share the ups and the downs. Let us look at a couple of stories which point towards the downward trajectory today.

Story 1: Father Charles Quinn has died and gone home to the Lord. I think about him from time to time and keep him in my prayers. With his retirement from the parishes of Jackson, Sherburn and Lakefield, I was assigned as pastor and Father Quinn took up residence in Sherburn. We would see each other often whether weekday Mass, weekend Mass, funerals, weddings, etc. We would ride together when we attended meetings and in our travels would share stories. He shared a story about driving home on a Friday after Thanksgiving and was thinking about the weddings he had on his docket. It was then that he realized, I am supposed to be doing a wedding in Jackson right now. He stomped on the accelerator. Arriving on the scene, everyone was present and in an apologetic tone told everyone that he was sorry. The wedding went on as planned albeit a little later than scheduled.

I used to rib him about it until...on one particular Saturday, I attended a graduation party earlier than the time on the card because I knew I had a wedding in Jackson. I hung around for a period of time and headed back to Jackson. As I got back to the church, the funeral home director met me and said, "The wedding party is looking for you. You are late for the wedding." I thought he was full of (I think you know the word) so we talked for a bit. Then he got serious and said, "Father, they have been looking for another minister because you are late." It then dawned on me that they had asked to have the wedding at an earlier time than we originally scheduled. With my head down and embarrassed, I went into the church. The bride was crying, people were restless and upset. I understood. I apologized and we got underway.

With the wedding finished, all I couple think about was the bride and groom and Father Quinn. I thought to myself, "I hope he never finds out." The next time we met, he had this smile on his face and I knew. Needless to say, he found out and never let me forget it.

The lesson: We are dealing with Murphy's Law. If you are going to make fun of another's mistake, be prepared because inevitably you will make the same mistake.

Story 2: While out duck hunting with my brother, the hunting had been slow on this particular morning. We were talking with another hunter when a flock of ducks landed on the far end of the lake. The man was willing to oar to the end of the lake, scare up the flock and if everything went as planned send them our way and we would get a shot. It took a period of time but then it happened. We heard a shot and the flock headed straight for us. My brother and I were no longer in the weeds so our boat had no way to support itself if we shot. In my excitement, I stood up to shoot only to hear my brother yelling, "Sit down. Sit down."

I didn't listen to him as there were shots to be fired. I shot and just then it happened. The boat rocked back and forth, not certain if it should tip over or not. With all this rocking motion and me still standing, the boat made its final decision. It would stay upright but a hunter had to go. Over I went and under I went. I was soaked. My brother was really upset now, "You (beep), when you aren't in the weeds, you can't stand up and shoot." Back in the boat, we headed to shore.

"But Father," you ask, "the story isn't complete as I need to know." Did you get a duck? The answer is "No" and maybe it was all for the best.

The lesson: Keep your life on firm footing. Keep close to the Lord and his ways and life is much more manageable.

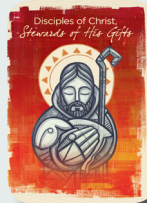

Did you know that many liturgy positions don't extend over the summer because liturgists do not have as much to organize during Ordinary Time following the Easter season? The same holds true for choir directors, as most choirs will stop meeting over the summer and return in the fall. Most parishioners, too, use the summer to go on vacation and spend more time with family. The number of people at a church, therefore, is usually quite low after Pentecost. The last parish I served at in Arizona was mostly for snow-birds. Over the summer, we'd be lucky to have 20 people at Mass.

Now, I think it's important to take vacations. I think liturgists, choir directors, ministers, and clergy should use the calm of Ordinary Time to renew their desire to love and serve. The last thing I like to see from anyone is burn-out. At the same time, I want to encourage you, too, to use this time to recommit ourselves to Christ. As much as I love the liturgies of the other seasons, it's easy to get stressed out by them with all of life's craziness. During this Ordinary Time, we have an opportunity to calmly and quietly pray to God, open our hearts to him without fear of time constraints, and create more opportunities to worship him and grow in his love.

This summer, I encourage you to incorporate your faith into your vacation plans, your family time, even your day-to-day life. For instance, visit a church along your travels, join us for an hour of adoration, or take ten minutes after dinner to pray as a family. There is an infinite amount of things you can do to become closer to Christ.

Don't let Christ be a second priority; rather, use your vacations and family time to express your gratitude and love for our loving Savior.
