Hope is a word we don't need any help understanding, do we? We say it all the time, like "I hope I get to sing in another opera soon," or "I hope I can see the Backstreet Boys live before they get too old to 'Quit Playing Games with My Heart.'" (And if you understood that joke, then I truly hope we can go to one of their concerts together.)

But the definition of hope in the Catholic Church goes a little bit deeper than a desire for something to happen or work out. And to define it, we need to understand the nature of God's divine love. As Father Chris Alar explains it, in order for there to be love, there must be three persons, a lover, a beloved, and a love between them. We can see this within the Trinity. God the Father is the lover; God the Son is the beloved. And the self-giving love between them is so great that it generates a third person, the Holy Spirit. This is divine love. In fact, a family is a mirror image of this. The father is the lover, the mother is the beloved, and their love between them is so great it generates a third person, a child.

When God calls us to him, we are not able to fully respond to that divine love by ourselves—after all, we are not divine. We are human. We must hope, then, that God will give us the ability to love him in return. And this is what hope is. Hope is confidence in God's self-giving love, knowing that because of it we can always receive forgiveness and are constantly invited to life everlasting with him.

Next week, we'll look at the opposite of hope: despair and presumption.
